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TRUSTEES' REPORT

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 28 FEBRUARY 2015

The Trustees present their report and accounts for the year ended 28 February 2015.

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in note 1 to the accounts and comply with the rticles of Association, the Companies Act 2006 and the Statement of Recommended Practice, "Accounting and Reporting by Charities", issued in March 2005.

Structure, governance and management

The Charity is a company limited by guarantee and was set up on 11 May 2001. It is governed by a memorandum and articles of association.

New Trustees are appointed by the existing Trustees having due regard to their qualifications, experience and the contribution they are likely to make to the Board.

None of the Trustees has any beneficial interest in the company. All of the Trustees are members of the company and guarantee to contribute £1 in the event of a winding up.

The Trustees determine the general policy of the Charity and Board meetings are held at regular intervals.

Other than the Trustees, there are no other related parties.

The Trustees have assessed the major risks to which the Charity is exposed, and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate exposure to the major risks.

Objectives and activities

The Charity's objects include raising funds to provide support for people who have cancer of the head and neck, and the maintenance of The About Face Centre. Awareness of head and neck cancer issues and support for the training of head and neck cancer surgeons are important to the charity.

The Trustees have paid due regard to guidance issued by the Charity Commission in deciding what activities the Charity should undertake.

Achievements and performance

About Face has continued to move from strength to strength over the reporting period. Its aims are always to support patients, and their families and carers who have been diagnosed with cancer of the head and neck. It has operated from the About Face Centre in Poole since 3rd December 2008 with a 24/7 emergency back-up. The twice weekly 'drop-in' on Tuesdays and Thursdays continued throughout the year as did the monthly evening support group. Progress was made in researching the growing need for regional support.

Supporting the surgical training of health professionals as they progress in their careers remains an objective and this is available in the Charity's library and practical suite. In helping to train future surgeons About Face believes it not only supports patients of today but of tomorrow too. One of the founding trustees Professor Velupillai Ilankovan was honoured to become President of the British Association of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons for 2014 and the Charity was represented at the association's international conference in Edinburgh by trustee Philip Tucker and Chief Executive Ian Catley. The Charity's model of local support to surgical departments was promoted.

Awareness of head and neck cancer issues remained a priority. This was boosted by the loan of a brand new sign-written vehicle from the Westover Group, a regional motor dealership. The Trustees recognise the Group's generosity and foresight in support of cancer patients.

Raising funds remains essential in the absence of any statutory financial support for our important work. About Face's presence on the LocalGiving.com website has proved fruitful. A fundraising barn dance organised by the new Chair Frances Burden raised £4,000, the Jaguar Enthusiasts Club Dorset Region supported the Charity once again this year with a £1,000 donation following their successful Wessex Car Show and members of Dudsbury Golf Club Seniors raised £2,450 in memory of former head and neck patient and Senior's Captain Basil Beeching. At the close of 2014 Ian Catley stepped down after seven years as Chief Executive and the Trustees appointed Annabelle Saunders to manage the Charity. Deputy Chair (and former Chair) Dr Anthony Pigott, who had given twelve months' notice to the Board that his time served as a Trustee would come to an end, stepped down at the close of the year. The Trustees thanked Dr Pigott and Ian Catley for the considerable contribution each had made throughout their time at About Face.

In January of 2015 The Purbeck Rally and Autojumble organisers presented a cheque for £500, a fundraising dinner dance organised by Nick Levens from Poole Hospital raised £653 for About Face, £1,485 was received in donations from the Christmas Appeal, £500 received from The Autumn Trust, £400 from St Aldhelm's Masonic Chapter and £698 raised by Helen Woolf for a fund raising sky dive. In February £271 was received from a fundraising event at Putlake Farm in Dorset.

Financial review

The charity has recorded a deficit for the year of £3,462 which gives a net surplus fund balance of £370,468 at the year-end.

It is the policy of the Charity that unrestricted funds which have not been designated for a specific use should be maintained at a level which will ensure that, in the event of a significant drop in funding, they will be able to continue the Charity's current activities, not just for the incumbent year but for all future years.

INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 28 FEBRUARY 2015

1 Accounting policies

1.1 Basis of preparation

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

The Charity has taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No 1 from the requirement to produce a cash flow statement on the grounds that it is a small Charity.

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards, the Statement of Recommended Practice, "Accounting and Reporting by Charities", issued in March 2005 and the Companies Act 2006.

1.2 Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the SOFA when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. For legacies, entitlement is the earlier of the charity being notified of an impending distribution or the legacy being received.

Gifts in kind donated for distribution are included at valuation and recognised as income when they are distributed to the projects. Donated facilities are included at the value to the charity where this can be quantified and a third party is bearing the cost.

1.3 Resources expended

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to the category. The charity's operating costs include premises and other related costs. Such costs are allocated between costs of activities in furtherance of the charity's objects, costs of generating funds and support costs. Other costs have been either specifically identified or apportioned on an appropriate basis to each category.

Governance costs are those incurred in connection with compliance with constitutional and statutory requirements.

1.4 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets other than freehold land are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows:

Freehold land is not depreciated

Freehold buildings 2% on cost Fixtures, fittings & equipment 15% on cost

1.5 Accumulated funds

Endowment funds are subject to specific conditions by donors that the capital must be maintained by the Charity.

Restricted funds are subject to specific conditions by donors as to how they may be used. The purposes and uses of the restricted funds are set out in the notes to the accounts.

Designated funds comprise funds which have been set aside at the discretion of the Trustees for specific purposes.
