ULTIMATE PARENT UNDERTAKING

The company's immediate parent undertaking is Canary Wharf Investment Holdings (DS1) Limited and its ultimate parent undertaking is Songbird Estates plc ('Songbird'), both companies are registered in England and Wales.

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES AND REVIEW OF BUSINESS

The principal activity of the company is property investment, although it held no investment properties during the period ended 31 December 2004.

The company has changed its accounting reference date from 30 June to 31 December to be consistent with its ultimate parent undertaking.

FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS

The company is expected to continue with its principal activity for the foreseeable future.

DIVIDENDS AND RESERVES

The profit and loss account for the period ended 31 December 2004 is set out on page 6. The directors do not recommend the payment of a dividend (2004: £27,300,000).

Details of interests and options to subscribe for shares in Songbird are disclosed as appropriate in the financial statements of either of the intermediate parent companies, Canary Wharf Estate Limited or Canary Wharf Group plc.

Other than the above, no director had any beneficial interest in the shares of the company, its parent undertakings or any of its subsidiaries at 31 December 2004 or at any time throughout the period then ended.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE PERIOD ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2004

1. PRINCIPAL ACCOUNTING POLICIES

A summary of the principal accounting policies of the company, all of which have been applied consistently throughout the period and the preceding year, is set out below.

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with applicable United Kingdom accounting standards.

In accordance with the provisions of FRS 1 (Revised) the company is exempt from the requirements to prepare a cash flow statement, as it is a wholly-owned subsidiary of Canary Wharf Group plc, a body incorporated in the European Union which has prepared a consolidated cash flow statement.

Interest receivable and interest payable

Interest receivable and payable are recognised in the period in which they fall due.

Turnover

Turnover, representing rents receivable, is recognised net of VAT in the period in which the rents become due.

2. OPERATING PROFIT

None of the directors received any emoluments in respect of their services to the company during the period.

No staff were employed by the company.

Auditors' remuneration has been borne by another group undertaking.

3. EXCEPTIONAL ITEMS

On 22 December 2003, the company sold its investment property to a fellow subsidiary undertaking for £74,000,000. This resulted in a profit on disposal of £27,300,000 and the reversal of the then prior year provision against diminution in value of £7,700,000. Both these items were taken to the profit and loss account and treated as exceptional items. This item did not give rise to deferred tax.
