The Directors have pleasure in presenting their report and the financial statements of the Company for the year ended 31 December 2009

Principal activities and business review

The company is the holding company of Eastbrook Facilities Limited ("EFL"), a property developer and investor with the sole purpose of developing and operating a headquarters office investment in Cambridge for the Department of Environment, Food and Rural Affairs ("DEFRA") (formerly MAFF) under the UK Government's Private Finance Initiative

In addition to holding 100% of EFL's ordinary shares, the company provides it with a subordinated loan currently standing at £6 1m

Results and dividends

The profit for the year amounted to £300,000 (2008 profit £nil)

Particulars of dividends paid are detailed in note 7 to the financial statements

The results for the year are in line with budget. The Directors anticipate that the Company will perform in line with budget in the coming financial year.

Key performance indicators

The performance of the company from a cash perspective is assessed on a six monthly basis by the testing of the covenants of the senior debt provider. The key indicator being the debt service cover ratio. The company has been performing well and has been compliant with the covenants laid out in the loan agreement.

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Companies Act 2006 and applicable Accounting Standards in the United Kingdom. The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis as the Company's financial projections indicate that sufficient funds will be generated to allow on-going obligations to be met as they fall due

The loan is due to be repaid on completion of the DEFRA contract, which is on a 30 year term with tenant optional breaks after years 15, 20 and 25. The coupon on the principal amount accrues daily and is payable in cash on 30 June and 31. December each year. Interest not settled by cash on these dates is added to the principal and the coupon accrues on this uplifted amount in the next interest year. Interest settled using this mechanism in the period was £152,900 (2008 £156,495). The investment sum was advanced under a subordinated loan agreement and is therefore unsecured, and would rank alongside ordinary creditors in the event of a winding up of the subsidiary.
