Directors' report for the year ended 31 March 2015

The directors submit their report and the audited financial statements of Autumnwindow No.2 Limited (the "Company") for the year ended 31 March 2015. The registered number of the Company is 4312827.

The directors' report has been prepared in accordance with the special provisions of Part 15 of the Companies Act 2006.

Principal activities and future developments

The Company's principal activity is the holding of investments. The directors do not anticipate any change in the foreseeable future.

Principal risks and uncertainties

The directors of BT Group plc (the ultimate controlling entity of the Company) manage the group's risks at a group level, rather than at an individual business unit level. For this reason, the Company's directors believe that a discussion of the group's risks would not be appropriate for an understanding of the development, performance or position of the Company's business. The principal risks and uncertainties of BT Group plc, which include those of the company, are discussed on pages 41 to 52 of the 2015 annual report of BT Group plc, which does not form part of this report.

Key performance indicators ("KPIs")

The directors of BT Group plc manage the group's operations on a divisional basis. For this reason, the Company's directors believe that analysis using key performance indicators for the Company is not necessary or appropriate for an understanding of the development, performance or position of the business of the Company.

Results and dividends

The loss on ordinary activities before taxation was £4,793 (2014: £4,708). The tax credit on loss on ordinary activities was £1,007 (2014: £1,083) which left a loss after taxation for the financial year of £3,786 (2014: £3,625).

The directors do not recommend the payment of a dividend in respect of the year ended 31 March 2015 (2014: £nil).

Accounting policies

Basis of accounting

The financial statements are prepared on the going concern basis, under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Companies Act 2006 and applicable accounting standards in the United Kingdom. The principal accounting policies, which have been consistently applied, are set out below.

The financial statements present information about the Company as an individual undertaking, and not about its group. The Company is exempt by virtue of s400 of the Companies Act 2006 from the requirement to prepare and deliver group financial statements as the financial statements of Autumnwindow No.2 Limited are consolidated in the financial statements of BT Group plc, the ultimate parent entity.

The preparation of financial statements requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of income and expenditure during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates. Estimates are used principally when accounting for investment impairment and taxes.

Interest Income

Interest income from inter-company receivables is based on the carrying amount and effective rate of interest for the instrument.

Taxation

The charge for taxation is based on the loss for the year and takes into account deferred tax.

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date, where transactions or events that result in an obligation to pay more tax in the future or a right to pay less tax in the future have occurred at the balance sheet date.

Accounting policies (Continued)

Investments

Investments are carried at cost, less provision for impairment. Investments are tested for impairment when an event that might affect asset values has occurred. An impairment loss is recognised to the extent that the carrying amount cannot be recovered either by selling the asset or by the discounted future cash flows from the investment.

Cash flow statement and related parties disclosures

The Company is a wholly-owned subsidiary of BT Group plc. The cash flows of the Company are included in the consolidated cash flow statement of BT Group plc, whose annual report is publicly available. Consequently, the Company is exempt under the terms of FRS 1 "Cash Flow Statement" from publishing a cash flow statement.

The company is also exempt under the terms of FRS 8 from disclosing related party transactions with entities that are part of the BT group.

Accounting standards, interpretations and amendments not yet effective

Following the publication of FRS 100 'Application of Financial Reporting Requirements' by the Financial Reporting Council, Autumnwindow No.2 Limited is required to change its accounting framework for its entity financial statements, which is currently UK GAAP, for its financial year commencing 1 April 2015. The purpose of FRS 100 is to align reporting in the UK with IFRS. As a qualifying subsidiary, the company will adopt FRS 101 'Reduced Disclosure Framework'.

As required by FRS 101, the company notified its shareholders of the proposed change.
