DIRECTORS' REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2006

The directors present their report and financial statements for the year ended 30 June 2006

Business review and principal activities

The principal activity of the company continued to be that of the provision of welfare-to-work services in the United Kingdom. The company completed its third year of operations with significant growth over previous years with turnover increasing by 49.9% to £28,885,144 (2005 £19,273,425). Net assets increased by 69.6% to £3,354,595 (2005 £1,977,642) during the year. It maintained strong cash balances during the year and expects to continue trading profitably in the forthcoming year.

The key business risks and uncertainties affecting the company are considered to relate to competition from other welfare-to-work service providers, results of government tenders and a change of government policy with respect to the role of the private sector in assisting the government to provide welfare-to-work services

Given the straightforward nature of the business, the company's directors are of the opinion that analysis using KPIs is not necessary for an understanding of the development, performance or position of the business

The external commercial environment is expected to remain competitive for the coming year, however the directors remain confident that the company has a good platform on which to consolidate and grow the business

The directors do not recommend payment of an ordinary dividend and the profit for the year has been transferred to reserves

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2006

1. Accounting policies for the year ended 30 June 2006

The principal accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these financial statements are set out below. These policies have been consistently applied to all the years presented, unless otherwise stated.

During 2006, the company has voluntarily adopted International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS's) for the year ended 30 June 2006, with the prior year comparatives restated. For the reconciliation of the results previously stated under UK GAAP to the results under IFRS, see note 24. The principal accounting policies adopted by the company are set out in note 2.

Basis of preparation

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards and IFRIC interpretations endorsed by the European Union (EU) and with those parts of the Companies Act, 1985 applicable to companies reporting under IFRS. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention as modified by the revaluation of land and buildings, available for sale investments, financial assets and liabilities held for trading. A summary of the more important accounting policies is set out below, together with an explanation of where changes have been made to previous policies on the adoption of new accounting standards in the year.

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires the use of estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Although these estimates are based on management's best knowledge of the amount, event or actions, actual results ultimately may differ from those estimates.

2. Accounting policies

Revenue recognition

Revenue represents income from employment services, net of VAT and trade discounts

Employment services revenue is recognised as income over the estimated period the services are provided. Revenue earned on the provision of services to individuals under welfare-to-work programmes is recognised over the period of time an individual is expected to remain in the programme. Programme start fees for welfare-to-work programmes are recognised on the date individuals enrol.

Intangible assets

Externally purchased product software licenses and similar intangible items are capitalised at historical cost and amortised on a straight line basis over their estimated useful lives

Property plant and equipment

Property, plant and equipment are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows

Leasehold improvements 5 years
Office equipment and fittings 3 years
Computer equipment 3 years

Leasing

Assets obtained under hire purchase contracts and finance leases are capitalised as tangible assets and depreciated over the shorter of the lease term and their useful lives. Obligations under such agreements are included in payables net of the finance charge allocated to future periods. The finance element of the rental payment is charged to the income statement so as to produce a constant periodic rate of charge on the net obligation outstanding in each period.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS (CONTINUED) FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2006

2. Continued .

Rentals payable under operating leases are charged against income on a straight line basis over the lease term. Benefits received and receivable as an incentive to sign an operating lease are similarly spread on a straight-line basis over the lease term.

Pension costs

The amount charged to the income statement represents the contributions payable by the company to the defined contribution pension scheme. There were outstanding contributions at the end of the year amounting to £40,028 (2005–£23,722) and these are included in other payables.

Share based payments

The movement in the value of the shares given to employees under the Employee Share Scheme is recognised as an expense. The expense calculation is made in accordance with the scheme's specified rules which restrict the fair value of the shares in the hands of scheme members. The effect of this at year end is an increase in provisions and a reduction in retained earnings.

Cash flow

Cash and cash equivalents comprise cash at bank and in hand and short term deposits. Short term deposits are defined as deposits with an initial maturity of three months or less

Foreign currency translation

Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rates of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. Transactions in foreign currencies are recorded at the rate ruling at the date of the transaction. All differences are taken to the income statement.

Taxation

Income tax expense represents the sum of the tax currently payable and deferred income tax

The tax currently payable is based on taxable profit for the year. Taxable profit differs from net profit as reported in the income statement because it excludes items of income or expense that are taxable or deductible in other years and it further excludes items that are never taxable or deductible. The company's liability for current tax is calculated using tax rates that have been enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date.

Deferred tax is provided in full in respect of taxation deferred by timing difference between the treatment of certain items for taxation and accounting purposes. The deferred tax balance has not been discounted.

Financial risk management

Credit Risk

The company considers that it has minimal credit risk as its revenues flow from medium term contracts with the British Government

Foreign exchange risk

The Company has negotiated with its overseas suppliers to invoice for all transactions in British Pound Sterling. The company therefore is currently not exposed to any material currency exchange risk.

Interest rate risk

The company finances its operations through retained profits and has minimal financing exposure on leased assets

Liquidity risk

The company seeks to manage financial risk to ensure sufficient liquidity is available to meet foreseeable needs and to invest cash assets safely and profitably

Financial instruments

Financial assets and liabilities are recognised on the company's balance sheet when the company becomes party to the contractual provisions of the instrument
