### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2011

### 1. Accounting Policies

### 1.1 Basis of preparation of financial statements

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008)

The company is the parent undertaking of a small group and as such is not required by the Companies Act 2006 to prepare group accounts. These financial statements therefore present information about the company as an individual undertaking and not about its group.

The amounts in these financial statements are expressed in thousands

### 12 Going concern

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis notwithstanding the fact that the company has a deficiency on shareholders funds at the end of the year. The directors consider this basis to be appropriate as the company has sufficient facilities available from its parent undertaking to fund its working capital requirements over the next twelve months.

### 13 Investments

Investments held as fixed assets are shown at cost less provision for impairment

### 1.4 Deferred taxation

Full provision is made for deferred tax assets and liabilities arising from all timing differences between the recognition of gains and losses in the financial statements and recognition in the tax computation

A net deferred tax asset is recognised only if it can be regarded as more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing differences can be deducted

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are calculated using the tax rates enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date and which are expected to apply in the periods in which the timing differences are expected to reverse

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are not discounted

### 1.5 Foreign currencies

Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at rates of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date

Transactions in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rate ruling on the date of the transaction

Exchange gains and losses are recognised in the profit and loss account

### 1.6 Financial instruments

Financial instruments are classified and accounted for, according to the substance of the contractual agreement, as either financial assets, financial liabilities or equity instruments. An equity instrument is any contract that evidences a residual interest in the assets of the company after deducting all of its liabilities.

### Factors that may affect future tax charges

The company has estimated tax losses of £478 (2010 £473) available for carry forward against future trading profits

There is a potential deferred tax asset of approximately £120 (2010 £128), which has not been recognised in the financial statements due to the uncertainty concerning the timescale as to its recoverability

It is anticipated that the deferred tax asset will be recovered when the company makes sufficient taxable profits

During the year, as a result of reductions in the UK main corporation tax rate to 26% with effect from 1 April 2011 and to 25% with effect from 1 April 2012, that were substantively enacted by the balance sheet date, the relevant deferred tax balances have been re-measured

Further reductions to the UK corporation tax rate were announced in the March 2012 Budget. The changes, which are expected to be enacted separately each year, propose to reduce the rate to 24% by 1 April 2012 and 22% by 1 April 2014. Since these changes had not been substantively enacted at the balance sheet date they are not recognised in these financial statements.
