

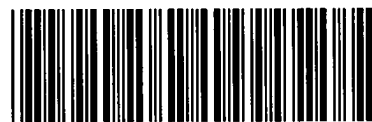



- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the company will continue in business.

The directors are responsible for keeping adequate accounting records that are sufficient to show and explain the company's transactions and disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the company and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. They have general responsibility for taking such steps as are reasonably open to them to safeguard the assets of the company and to prevent and detect fraud and other irregularities.



1. Principal accounting policies

The following accounting policies have been applied consistently in dealing with items which are considered material in relation to the company's financial information.

Basis of preparation

These financial statements were prepared in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 102 The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland ("FRS 102") as issued in August 2014. The amendments to FRS 102 issued in July 2015 and effective immediately have been applied. The presentation currency of these financial statements is sterling.

The accounting policies set out below have, unless otherwise stated, been applied consistently to all periods presented in these financial statements.

Cash flow statement

Under Section 1A of Financial Reporting Standard 102, the company is exempt from the requirement to prepare a cash flow statement because it meets the criteria for a small company as defined by the Companies Act 2006, Sections 382 to 384.

Taxation

Income tax comprises current and deferred tax. Income tax is recognised in the profit and loss account except to the extent that it relates to items directly in equity, in which case it is recognised in equity.

Current tax is the expected tax payable on the taxable income for the year, using tax rates enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date, and any adjustment to tax payable in respect of previous years.

Deferred tax is provided using the balance sheet liability method, providing for temporary differences between the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities for financial reporting purposes and the amounts used for taxation purposes. The amount of deferred tax provided is based on the expected manner of realisation or settlement of the carrying amount of the assets and liabilities, using tax rates enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date.

A deferred tax asset is recognised only to the extent that it is probable that future taxable profits will be available against which the asset can be utilised. Deferred tax assets are reduced to the extent that it is no longer probable that the related tax benefit will be realised.

Going concern

The company's business activities, together with factors likely to affect its future developments and position, are set out in the Business Review section of the Directors' Report.

The financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis, notwithstanding the renegotiation of the bank loan, which the directors believe to be appropriate for the following reasons. The company is dependent for its working capital on funds provided to it by Carillion Richardson Partnership, the company's parent undertaking. The Carillion Richardson Partnership has provided the company with an undertaking that for at least 12 months from the date of approval of these financial statements, it will continue to make available such funds as are needed by the company and in particular will not seek repayment of the amounts currently made available. This should enable the company to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future by meeting its liabilities as they fall due for payment.

The directors having assessed the responses of the partners of the company's parent Carillion Richardson Partnership to their enquiries have no reason to believe that a material uncertainty exists that may cast significant doubt about the ability of the Carillion Richardson Partnership to continue as a going concern.

(c) Factors that may affect future tax charges

The UK corporation tax rate reduced from 21% to 20% with effect from 1 April 2015. Further reductions to 19% (effective from 1 April 2017) and 17% (effective from 1 April 2020) were substantively enacted on 26 October 2015 and 6 September 2016 respectively. This will reduce the company's future tax charge accordingly.

There are unrecognised deferred tax assets of £535,519 (2015: £505,001).
