YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2005

The trustees, who are also Directors for the purposes of the Companies Act, present their report and the unaudited financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2005.

INTRODUCTION

The charity has been set up to help protect the natural beauty and help improve the existing facilities and resources of Roundhay Park, Leeds West Yorkshire.

OBJECTIVES

The company has set four main objectives for the charity, these are

- (1) To take over the business and assets and liabilities of an unincorporated association known as Friends of Roundhay Park.
- (2) To work for the enhancement, maintenance and use of Roundhay Park, Leeds.
- (3) To protect the natural beauty and help improve the existing facilities and resources of the park.
- (4) To increase public awareness of the park and its environs.

FINANCIAL CONTROLS

The charity is administrated by the directors/trustees of the company.

INVESTMENT POWERS AND RESTRICTIONS

The directors/trustees are only permitted to use the charity's assets solely towards the promotion of the objectives of the charity.

REVIEW OF DEVELOPMENTS, ACTIVITIES AND ACHIEVEMENTS

During the year substantial progress was made with the Restoration of the Park with the support of the Heritage Lottery Fund. The charity has been involved in the work as it has taken place. The Friends Garden built by volunteers is also nearing completion.

The charity has also been involved in mobilising public opinion resulting in the external restoration of the Mansion and initiating a debate about its future use.

RESULTS

The results for the year, and the charity's financial position at the end of the year are shown in the attached financial statements.

TRUSTEES' RESPONSIBILITIES
