STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

GOVERNING DOCUMENT

The organisation is a charitable company limited by guarantee, incorporated on 3 July 2002 and registered as a charity on 27 May 2003. The company was established under a Memorandum of Association which established the objects and powers of the charitable company and is governed under its Articles of Association. In the event of the company being wound up members are required to contribute an amount not exceeding £10.

RECRUITMENT AND APPOINTMENT OF DIRECTORS AND TRUSTEES

The directors of the company are also charity trustees for the purpose of charity law and under the company's Articles of Association are known as Trustees. Under the requirements of the Memorandum of Association one third of the trustees are required to retire at each annual general meeting by rotation. They may be re-elected by the remaining trustees.

The trustees may appoint a person who is willing to be a trustee whether to fill a vacancy or as an additional trustee

RISK MANAGEMENT

The trustees are conducting a review of the major risks to which the charity is exposed. A risk register has been proposed and will be updated at least annually. Where appropriate, systems or procedures have been established to mitigate the risks faced by the charity

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

The Company has set two main objectives for the charity, these are -

- (1) To promote the preservation, restoration, maintenance and improvement of Roundhay Park Leeds for the benefit of the public
- (2) To promote the benefit of Leeds and the surrounding areas by associating the local authorities and inhabitants in a common effort to provide facilities in the interest of social welfare for recreation and leisure time occupation with the objects of improving the conditions of life for the inhabitants

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

This has been another very busy year for FoRP, thanks to the efforts of The Trustees, The Committee and our Members
The Action Plan continues to form the foundation for our core activities and will again be reviewed at the end of 2014

During this year, 60 new Members have joined and we now have a total Membership in excess of 449. As some of these are Joint Memberships, this means that we have 624 actual Members

The Working Parties go from strength to strength, continuing the long-term Arboretum Project, Friends' Garden Maintenance, the creation of a new and larger Wildflower Meadow, Litter Picking and Himalayan Balsam removal New additions are Maintenance Works in the formal areas of the Park, working alongside Park Staff and organising and supervising Corporate Working Parties of up to 80 people or so

The FoRP Calendar continues to be a real success and adds substantially to our funds. The 2015 edition is now in hand

The Tree Trail Brochure is selling well in various outlets. All of the material collected as part of the Tree Trail exercise is now to be produced as a "coffee table" book, with an initial production of 40 copies.

Work to the Tennis Courts has started at last and should be completed for this Summer, so now we shall be able to focus more on improving the Skate Park

We have worked with OTRA (Oakwood Traders' and Residents' Association) to raise funds for the repair and refurbishment of Oakwood Clock. A successful Application to The Lottery Fund means that enough has now been raised to do all of the works to the Clock and its structure. Plans are now in hand to enable the whole of the surrounding area to be improved.

We have continued to work closely with Kerr Mackie School and the children have helped with Balsam Removal and Bulb Planting As a reciprocal gesture, FoRP cleared the (large) wildlife pond at the School

A recent Survey of Friends' Groups by Leeds City Council asked for an estimate of days spent in voluntary work. We assessed that FoRP amass more than 250 (eight-hour) person days per annum actually working in Roundhay Park. This excludes Corporate Groups and the many hours spent on administration, planning and implementation on other Projects. This time is given willingly by The Trustees, The Committee and the Membership of the Friends of Roundhay Park.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

During the year the charity has made a surplus on its general activities of £5,269 (2013 deficit £503) and a deficit on its restricted fund of £27,054 (2013 surplus £27,054). The unrestricted and restricted funds now stand at £17,126 and £nil respectively (2013 £11,858 and £27,054) respectively.

RESERVES POLICY

The trustees have examined the charity's requirements for reserves in light of the main risks of the organisation. It has established a policy whereby the unrestricted funds of the charity should be a minimum of 6 months based on the budgeted expenditure for the following year. The budgeted expenditure for 2014/15 is anticipated to be £7,400.

INVESTMENT POWERS AND RESTRICTIONS

The directors/trustees are only permitted to use the charity's assets solely towards the promotion of the objectives of the charity

PLANS FOR FUTURE PERIODS

Funds will be used for purchasing plants, tools and materials to maintain areas improved by Friends of Roundhay Park and other areas yet to be identified
