#### Structure, governance and management

#### **Governing Document**

The organisation is a charitable company limited by guarantee, incorporated on 3 July 2002 and registered as a charity on 27 May 2003. The company was established under a Memorandum of Association which established the objects and powers of the charitable company and is governed under its Articles of Association. In the event of the company being wound up members are required to contribute an amount not exceeding £10.

#### Recruitment and appointment of directors and Trustees

The directors of the company are also charity trustees for the purpose of charity law and under the company's Articles of Association are known as Trustees. Under the requirements of the Memorandum of Association one third of the trustees are required to retire at each annual general meeting by rotation. They may be re-elected by the remaining trustees.

The trustees may appoint a person who is willing to be a trustee whether to fill a vacancy or as an additional trustee.

#### **Honorary President**

Dr Majorie Ziff MBE is the Honorary President.

#### Objectives and activities

The Company has set two main objectives for the charity, these are:-

- (1) To promote the preservation, restoration, maintenance and improvement of Roundhay Park Leeds for the benefit of the public.
- (2) To promote the benefit of Leeds and the surrounding areas by associating the local authorities and inhabitants in a common effort to provide facilities in the interest of social welfare for recreation and leisure time occupation with the objects of improving the conditions of life for the inhabitants.

#### Strategic report

The following sections for achievements and performance and financial review form the strategic report of the charity.

#### Achievements and performance

This has been another busy year with membership increasing to 1622 from 1334 last year and 798 the year before. Our Twitter account was launched in September and digital communication with members and the public continues through Facebook and our Website. The Newsletter provides our main communication with members and it achieves this with an ever increasing professionalism.

We continue the planting and maintenance of the Friends' Garden and other areas, supporting Leeds City Council with general maintenance and remedial works throughout the Park. Our litter picking teams continue to make the Park and surrounding areas a pleasant sanctuary for all.

Income from calendar sales has continued and the introduction of duck food sales at the Lakeside Cafe has been very well received and profitable.

The Outdoor Gym was completed and we have provided tree lights between the Roundhay Fox and the tram terminus car park on Princes Avenue on an annual hire agreement. We undertook a public survey on the facilities and usage of the Playground by the Lakeside Cafe, which is in a sad state. The results were discussed with Leeds City Council, which does not have any surplus funds in these difficult times, so we decided to launch an appeal for £100,000 for refurbishment of the area. We have committed £20,000 of our general reserves to get the ball rolling.

The Trustees believe that this has been a year of achievement and continued strengthening of our relationships with Leeds City Council and the Park Management. Long may this continue to the benefit of the Park.

#### Financial review

During the year the charity has made a surplus on its general activities of £2,803 (2017: £4,841 deficit) and a surplus on its restricted fund of £nil (2017: £nil). The unrestricted and restricted funds now stand at £28,777 and £nil respectively (2017: £25,974 and £nil) respectively. During the year the trustees designated £20,000 of unrestricted funds towards the Playground fund.

#### **Reserves Policy**

The trustees have examined the charity's requirements for reserves in light of the main risks of the organisation. It has established a policy whereby the unrestricted funds of the charity should be a minimum of 6 months based on the budgeted expenditure for the following year. The budgeted expenditure for 2017/18 is anticipated to be £9,000.

#### **Investment Powers And Restrictions**

The directors/trustees are only permitted to use the charity's assets solely towards the promotion of the objectives of the charity.

#### **Plans for Future Periods**

Funds will be used for purchasing plants, tools and materials to maintain areas improved by Friends of Roundhay Park and other areas yet to be identified.

#### Year ended 31 March 2018

#### 1. General information

The charity is a public benefit entity and a private company limited by guarantee, registered in England and Wales and a registered charity in England and Wales. The address of the registered office is 305 Roundhay Road, Leeds, LS8 4HT.

#### 2. Statement of compliance

These financial statements have been prepared in compliance with FRS 102, 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland', the Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (Charities SORP (FRS 102)) and the Companies Act 2006.

#### 3. Accounting policies

#### Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis.

The financial statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the entity.

#### Going concern

There are no material uncertainties about the charity's ability to continue.

#### Disclosure exemptions

The entity satisfies the criteria of being a qualifying entity as defined in FRS 102. Its financial statements are consolidated into the financial statements of (enter name of group financial statements) which can be obtained from (enter detail). As such, advantage has been taken of the following disclosure exemptions available under paragraph 1.12 of FRS 102:

(a) No cash flow statement has been presented for the company.(b) Disclosures in respect of financial instruments have not been presented.

#### Judgements and key sources of estimation uncertainty

The preparation of the financial statements requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported. These estimates and judgements are continually reviewed and are based on experience and other factors, including expectations of future events that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances.

#### **Fund accounting**

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees to further any of the charity's purposes.

Restricted funds are subjected to restrictions on their expenditure declared by the donor or through the terms of an appeal, and fall into one of two sub-classes: restricted income funds or endowment funds.

#### 3. Accounting policies (continued)

#### Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when entitlement has passed to the charity; it is probable that the economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the charity and the amount can be reliably measured. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income:

- income from donations or grants is recognised when there is evidence of entitlement to the gift, receipt is probable and its amount can be measured reliably.
- legacy income is recognised when receipt is probable and entitlement is established.
- income from donated goods is measured at the fair value of the goods unless this is impractical to measure reliably, in which case the value is derived from the cost to the donor or the estimated resale value. Donated facilities and services are recognised in the accounts when received if the value can be reliably measured. No amounts are included for the contribution of general volunteers.
- income from contracts for the supply of services is recognised with the delivery of the
  contracted service. This is classified as unrestricted funds unless there is a contractual
  requirement for it to be spent on a particular purpose and returned if unspent, in which case
  it may be regarded as restricted.

#### Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accruals basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure includes any VAT which cannot be fully recovered, and is classified under headings of the statement of financial activities to which it relates:

- expenditure on raising funds includes the costs of all fundraising activities, events, noncharitable trading activities, and the sale of donated goods.
- expenditure on charitable activities includes all costs incurred by a charity in undertaking
  activities that further its charitable aims for the benefit of its beneficiaries, including those
  support costs and costs relating to the governance of the charity apportioned to charitable
  activities.
- other expenditure includes all expenditure that is neither related to raising funds for the charity nor part of its expenditure on charitable activities.

All costs are allocated to expenditure categories reflecting the use of the resource. Direct costs attributable to a single activity are allocated directly to that activity. Shared costs are apportioned between the activities they contribute to on a reasonable, justifiable and consistent basis.

#### 4. Limited by guarantee

The Charity is a company limited by guarantee and has no share capital. In the event of the charity being wound up, the liability in respect of the guarantee is limited to £10 per member of the charity.
