#### THE DIRECTORS' REPORT

#### YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2013

The directors present their report and the financial statements of the company for the year ended 31 March 2013

#### Principal activity and business review

The principal activity of the business during the year is the supply of valuation services

The strategy of controlled growth and diversification of source of surveys has worked well and the board is pleased with the growth in both turnover and profitability during the year. Clearly the level of losses and in particular legal fees to defend speculative claims associated with historic surveys subject to Professional Indemnity Insurance remains an area of intense focus for the board, albeit good progress has been made during the year in reducing this potential liability and the company is is conscious that this is approaching the 6 year age cut off with regards to potential claims from surveys undertaken prior to the credit crunch in 2007

#### 1. Accounting policies

#### Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008)

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis, which assumes that the company will continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future, based on the continued support of its fellow group undertakings, directors and the company's bankers. The directors have prepared projections for the period to 31 March 2017. These projections have been prepared using assumptions which the directors consider to be appropriate to the current financial position of the company as regards to current expected revenues and its cost base.

The directors therefore consider it appropriate to continue to prepare the financial statements on a going concern basis. The financial statements do not include any adjustments that may be necessary in the event that adequate funding was not made available.

#### **Cash flow statement**

The company has taken advantage of the exemption in FRS 1 from the requirement to produce a cash flow statement on the grounds that it is small company

#### Turnover

Turnover comprises revenue recognised by the company when a valuation report is issued, exclusive of value added tax

#### Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Depreciation is calculated so as to write off the cost of an asset, net of anticipated disposal proceeds, over the useful economic life of that asset as follows

Motor vehicles

- 25% reducing balance

Office and computer equipment

- 33% reducing balance

The cost of tangible fixed assets is the purchase price together with any incidental costs of acquisition

#### Operating lease agreements

Rentals applicable to operating leases where substantially all of the benefits and risks of ownership remain with the lessor are charged against profits on a straight line basis over the period of the lease

#### **Deferred taxation**

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date, where transactions or events that result in an obligation to pay more or a right to pay less tax in the future have occurred by the balance sheet date with certain limited exceptions

Deferred tax is calculated on an undiscounted basis at the tax rates that are expected to apply in the periods in which the timing differences are expected to reverse, based on tax rates and laws enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date

#### Financial instruments

Financial instruments are classified and accounted for, according to the substance of the contractual arrangement, as either financial assets, financial liabilities or equity instruments. An equity instrument is any contract that evidences a residual interest in the assets of the company after deducting all of its liabilities.

#### Claims provision

The company provides for the estimated liability for claims where the customer has suffered a loss resulting from past valuations of properties that are proven to be the fault of the company
