REPORT OF THE DIRECTORS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2006

The Directors (who are also the Trustees) present their annual report and financial statements of the company for the year ended 31 March 2006. The company is limited by guarantee without a share capital.

Status of the Company - Limited by Guarantee

The liability of the Members is limited. Every Member of the Company undertakes to contribute such amount as may be required but not exceeding £1 to the Company's assets if it should be wound up.

Principal Activities

The principal objects of the Company are to help children and young people, especially but not exclusively through recreation and leisure time activities and supplementary education so as to develop their physical, mental and spiritual capacities that they may grow to full maturity as individuals and members of a multicultural society.

Review of Operations

The past year has been a busy but successful time for Docklands Youth Services with some remarkable developments taking place. I would like to thank all those that have offered their support throughout the year, particularly Tracey Betts and the Isle of Dogs Community Foundation who have been involved since the start of DYS.

At the beginning of the year, a decision was taken for George Green School, in partnership with Docklands Youth Services and the Isle of Dogs Community Foundation to submit a tender document to procure the Youth Contract for the Isle of Dogs.

This involved a tremendous amount of work and Stella Bailey was nominated to undertake the task. The bid has been successful and the Partnership will begin to deliver the Youth Service in January 2007. We are extremely grateful to Stella and would like to acknowledge that the success of the bid was mainly due to her tireless dedication, vast experience and commitment to the local community.

Another successful development this year has been production of a regular newsletter, funded by St Katherine and Shadwell Trust that has been overseen by Jose, our part time Administrator whose post is funded by IDCF. Jose has now been in post for two years and there has been a major improvement in administration procedures since his arrival. The majority of groups, members of DYS receive funding from IDCF who each year provide £40,000 towards Summer Play schemes and Jose has taken on the responsibility for monitoring the grant as well as co-ordinating an end of summer evaluation for Funders.

The future for DYS is looking extremely positive and I believe that the following year will see major developments for the Organisation.

INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT TO THE MEMBERS

STATEMENT OF THE DIRECTORS' RESPONSIBILITIES

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2006

ACCOUNTING POLICIES FOR THE YEAR ENDED

31 MARCH 2006

1. Accounting convention

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards.

Donations, gifts and other income

Donations, gifts and other income are credited as income in the year in which they are received.

Grants receivable

Subject to the following, grants are credited as income in the year in which they are receivable. Grants received for specific purposes are accounted for as restricted funds. Where donor-imposed restrictions apply to the timing of the related expenditure as a pre-condition for its use, the grant is treated as deferred income until those restrictions are met.

Charitable expenditure

Direct charitable expenditure includes all expenditure incurred on grants awarded or on other schemes run in pursuance of the Charity's objectives under its Charter. The direct costs of supporting these activities, including staff, establishment and other overhead costs are separately analysed and shown as support costs under this heading.

Tangible fixed assets

Major expenditure on tangible fixed assets will be capitalised. The cost of other items is written off as incurred.

Going concern

The accounts have been prepared on a going concern basis as the Directors consider that the current and future sources of funding or support will be adequate for the Company's needs.

Transfers

Council, in accordance with its powers and within the restrictions imposed by such, may approve the transfer of any small deficit from restricted funds to unrestricted funds from time to time.
