The Directors are satisfied with the results for the year

The 267% decrease in profit before interest and tax from 2011 to 2012 is due to an impairment of \$8,206,924 recognised in 2012 in respect of the post balance sheet sale of a property owned by the company

Goodrich Corporation was acquired by United Technologies Corporation (UTC) on 26th July 2012. The Directors welcome the change in ownership and the company intends to continue with its activities and has no plans for substantially developing the business activities.

RESULTS AND DIVIDENDS

The loss for the year, after taxation, amounted to \$3,672,490 (2011 - profit \$2,957,830)

There were no ordinary dividends proposed, declared or paid in the year (2011 - \$Nil)

PRINCIPAL RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The principal risks and uncertainties facing the company are grouped as financial risks, foreign currency risks and liquidity risks

Financial Risks

The company's policy does not permit trading in any financial instruments. The company's principal financial instruments comprise of cash and short term deposits and/or borrowings, the main purpose of which is to provide finance for its normal trading operations and to reduce the impact of currency exchange rate movements on trading results

Foreign Currency Risks

The company enters into transactions in the normal course of business which are denominated in currencies other than the US Dollar. As a result, the value of the company's non-dollar denominated revenues, payments, financial assets and liabilities and cash flows can be significantly affected by movement in exchange rates in general and in the US Dollar in particular.

The company manages its exposure to currency movements by working with the Group's Treasury department to review the impact of exchange rate fluctuations

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS for the year ended 31 December 2012

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1.1 BASIS OF PREPARATION OF FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards

The financial statements have been prepared under the going concern concept because the company will continue to receive financial support from a parent undertaking, Latin American Holding Inc., which has agreed to provide adequate funds for the company to meet its liabilities as they fall due

1.2 CASH FLOW

The company, being a subsidiary undertaking where 90% or more of the voting rights are controlled within the group whose consolidated financial statements are publicly available, is exempt from the requirement to draw up a cash flow statement in accordance with FRS 1

1.3 TANGIBLE FIXED ASSETS AND DEPRECIATION

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is not charged on freehold land. Depreciation on other tangible fixed assets is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost of those assets, less their estimated residual value, over their expected useful lives on the following bases.

Freehold property

40 years

1.4 TAXATION

Corporation tax payable is provided on taxable profits at the current rate

1.5 DEFERRED TAXATION

Full provision is made for deferred tax assets and liabilities arising from all timing differences between the recognition of gains and losses in the financial statements and recognition in the tax computation

A net deferred tax asset is recognised only if it can be regarded as more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing differences can be deducted

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are calculated at the tax rates expected to be effective at the time the timing differences are expected to reverse

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are not discounted

1.6 RENTAL INCOME

Rental income from operating leases, excluding charges for service, is recognised on a straight-line basis over the period of the lease

FACTORS THAT MAY AFFECT FUTURE TAX CHARGES

Claims for capital allowances are running in advance of depreciation — Whether this continues to be the case depends on the level of capital allowance claims in the future and the level of future investment in fixed assets

Deferred tax has been calculated at the rate expected to apply at the time at which timing differences are forecast to reverse, based on tax rates which have been substantively enacted at the balance sheet date. During the year, as a result of the changes in the UK corporation tax rate to 24% which was substantively enacted on 26 March 2012 and was effective from 1 April 2012, and to 23% which was substantively enacted on 3 July 2012 and will be effective from 1 April 2013, the relevant deferred tax balances have been re-measured

Further reductions to the UK corporation tax rate have been announced. The changes propose to reduce the rate to 21% from 1 April 2014 and to 20% from 1 April 2015. The changes had not been substantively enacted at the balance sheet date and, therefore, are not recognised in these financial statements. It is not expected that these further reductions will materially impact the deferred tax balance.

16. CONTINGENT LIABILITIES

As part of a multilateral guarantee, the company has entered an agreement with the bank, its parent undertaking, fellow subsidiaries and other related companies. Under this agreement, the company is party to a cross-undertaking on a limited number of specified accounts, limited to the credit balance standing within a group wide cash pooling facility.

The company participates in a cash pooling arrangement with a group of UK Goodrich companies At 31 December 2012 there was a cash pool surplus of £3,505,547 (2011 - surplus £7,489,062) representing the bank balances of all the group companies

17. RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

The company has taken advantage of the exemptions of Financial Reporting Standard 8, not to disclose transactions with other group entities, as it is a wholly owned subsidiary undertaking of a company that is to prepare consolidated financial statements

18. POST BALANCE SHEET EVENTS

On the 26th March 2013, land and buildings owned by the company were sold as part of a group disposal of the Power Systems business based in Pitstone in the United Kingdom. The sale resulted in an impairment being recognised in the financial statements for the year ended 31st December 2012 of \$8,206,924.

19. ULTIMATE PARENT UNDERTAKING AND CONTROLLING PARTY

The company's immediate parent undertaking is Rosemount Aerospace Limited, a company registered in England and Wales

On the 26th July 2012 United Technologies, a company incorporated in the United States of America, acquired 100% of the share capital of Goodrich Corporation, the company's previous ultimate parent undertaking. The only group of which the company is a member and for which group financial statements are prepared for the year ended 31st December 2012 is that headed by United Technologies Corporation.
