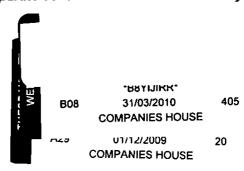

The company operates a recycling programme in the North West of England with the emphasis on reducing landfill and offening work, training and volunteering opportunities to local residents, particularly those who have a history of mental health problems or custodial sentences. During the financial year 2008/09 the company has developed its portfolio and increased its activity in West Lancashire. The following achievements have been realised.

- * An additional 5 members of the local community have gained employment with the company
 * 80,000 kilos of household goods and furniture have been reintroduced into the community and therefore rescued from landfill
- * A further 10,000 square feet of disused warehouse space has been developed and utilised for the expansion of the project
- * 51 local residents have gained an NVQ level 2 in Warehousing and Distribution and 14 have gained an NVQ Level 2 in Customer Service
- * 26 Training Placement opportunities have been created for local students
- 67 Volunteering opportunities have been created within this period

The stakeholders in the company include European Funding Bodies, Statutory bodies such as Job Centre Plus and Council for Voluntary Services as well as local Training Providers such as Training West Lancashire (we offer a placement provision) and Business Focus (We offer a training facility)

The European funders are afforded a quarterly report and financial return. We are subject to public audit through article 4 of the auditing commission. During this financial period we have undergone full audit and end of programme audit from an independent source - each of which had full positive results.

The other stakeholders are kept informed of development via service level agreements and regular meeting to discuss progress and improvements

The public for whom the project serve have been surveyed twice within this period and some of the feedback and suggestions have been incorporated into the day to day running of the programme which included

- * Extending opening hours to include Saturday full day hours
- Improved signage on vans in order to further promote the services
- Involvement with local schools to assist in the education of recycling and landfil issues

We were also assisted in a wider survey of partners through consultation with Social Science department of Lancaster University in order to take on board partner suggestions
