### Governing document

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a memorandum and articles of association, and constitutes a limited company, limited by guarantee, as defined by the Companies Act 2006.

### STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

### Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

The Board of Trustees will be elected annually by the members at the Annual General Meeting of the Charity and retiring members shall be eligible for re-election without further nomination.

Invitations for nominations for the position of Trustee will be sent to all members with the notice of the Annual General Meeting. Completed nominations will be accepted up to seven days before the date of the meeting. All nominations require the signature of the nominated person and the signature of a proposor and seconder all of which shall be members of the Charity.

Unless otherwise determined by the Charity in General Meeting the number of Trustees shall be not less than two and not more than ten.

### Risk management

The trustees have a duty to identify and review the risks to which the charity is exposed and to ensure appropriate controls are in place to provide reasonable assurance against fraud and error.

### **OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES**

### Objectives and aims

To provide a community transport service for the inhabitants of the Llyn community who are in need of such a service because of age, sickness or disability (mental or physical), or poverty, or because of a lack of availability of adequate and safe public passenger services.

Through the provision of its services O Ddrws i Ddrws aims to tackle the problems of isolation, lack of accessibility to services and improve health.

#### Public benefit

The charity benefits the public by providing transport to those who are in need of such a service because of age, sickness or disability (mental or physical), or poverty, or because of a lack of availability of adequate and safe public passenger services.

The main purpose is to take people to hospital appointments, provide transport for community and voluntary groups, and to provide transport between the rural coastal villages in the area for residents who would otherwise not be able to travel between these villages.

The charity has had regard to the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit.

### ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

#### Charitable activities

O Ddrws i Ddrws continued to give its door to door service to clients. A total of 4820 journeys were undertaken. The main uses were for hospital (794 journeys) and doctor appointments (259 journeys), Day Centre (659) and Nursing Home (350 visits). The service is also used for work (362 journeys). Other uses are for shopping (691 journeys), chiropodist, dentist, opticians, youth activities and school visits.

The clients are mainly elderly, disabled and frail but we also take individuals to their place of work as well as offer our services to agencies working with disadvantaged people, taking them to training opportunities, to volunteer or other motivational activities.

The service has been used by community groups and schools for outings and educational visits.

The service is used by the NHS as well as Gwynedd Loan Authority Departments.

The area of activity is the Llyn Peninsula. We offer our service to residents of this area who need to travel out to hospital appointments outside the area. People are taken from their own home to their appointments and back. Clients are regularly taken to hospital appointments as far a Liverpool and Oswestry, as well as Glan Clwyd Hospital, Llandudno and Bangor.

To run the service O Ddrws i Ddrws uses three vehicles, one MPV carrier and 2 minibuses. One driver is employed full time and two work on a self-employed basis as and when they are needed. For wheelchair users the fully adapted vehicles are usually needed, but around a third of clients are carried by volunteers in their own cars. We have 7 volunteer drivers who help out regularly.

### FINANCIAL REVIEW

### Reserves policy

The charity has no policy regarding reserves in place.

### Principal funding sources

We are grateful to all our funders for their annual support.

O Ddrws i Ddrws received funding to run the Llyn Coastal Bus service. This is a pilot project to run a bus along the Llyn coast aimed at encouraging people to walk the coastal path. The organisation needed to acquire a Section 22 permit from the Traffic Commissioner to run this flexible local bus service. It was started off in April 2015 with one bus running regularly between Nefyn, Aberdaron and Abersoch along the coast. In July a second bus was commissioned so that the service ran regularly 5 times a day on three days - Sundays, Tuesdays and Thursdays.

Another welcomed development was the running of the Llyn Bus to Ysbyty Gwynedd. This ran every Monday, Wednesday and Friday. It was financed through a pilot 'Access to Health' fund held by Cyngor Gwynedd Local Authority. The project was initially a 3 month project starting in November 2015, but due to its success was extended to June 2016 when the service will end unless funding is forthcoming from elsewhere. We continued to discuss and explore possibilities with the Non-emergency Patient Transport service within the Ambulance Service. The fact that the Llyn Bus to Ysbyty Gwynedd has run successfully showcases the possibilities of using Community Transport.

We are also thankful to all our charitable funders - Asda, Santander Foundation and the Scottish Power Foundation. We have developed a strong relationship with the Scottish Power Community Liaison manager and through him managed to get the Scottish Power team to create a garden for Nefyn School as a team building exercise. We are proud of the partnership that has developed between us and the school since then.

### **FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS**

Funds for running the service Bws Arfordir Llyn Coastal Bus will continue until October 2016 and funding for the management, to prepare a forward strategy, will continue until March 2017.

The Ambulance Service has been directed to use Community Transport to enhance their non-emergency ambulance service. We hope that this will lead to O Ddrws i Ddrws receiving more full-cost-recovery contracts to take clients to hospital appointments, especially takings patients regularly for cancer treatment and renal dialysis.

The cost of the service exceeds the income generated from fares and therefore we will continue to seek out revenue funding through grant applications and charitable giving.

### **CO-OPERATION**

O Ddrws i Ddrws realises the importance of working in partnership with others on many different levels. We attend a forum of Community Transport organisations which is convened by the Community Transport Association. We also attended the Annual Conference in Swansea.

The Llyn Coastal Bus service came about through cooperation with the Heritage Sector in Llyn. Without their support and encouragement it would never have got off the ground. We also have a good working relationship with the Transport Department at Gwynedd Council who welcomed our bid to run the Llyn to Ysbyty Gwynedd service.

# Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 31 January 2016

### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

### Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the Companies Act 2006 and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities.

#### Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included on the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

### Resources expended

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

### Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Plant and machinery etc

- 25% on reducing balance

#### **Taxation**

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

#### Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

### Government grants

Grants towards capital expenditure are released to the profit and loss account over the expected useful life of the assets. Grants towards revenue expenditure are released to the profit and loss account as the related expenditure is incurred.

### Share Capital

The company does not have any share capital. The liability of members is limited by guarantee, every member of the company undertakes to contribute to the assets of the company, in the event of it being wound up while they are a member, or within one year after they cease to be a member, for payment of the debtors and liabilities of the company, contracted before they cease to be a member, and of the costs, charges and expenses of winding up and for the adjustment of the rights and contributories amongst themselves, such amount as may be required not exceeding one pound.
