REPORT OF THE ACCOUNTANTS TO THE DIRECTORS

PURSUANT TO PARAGRAPH 24 OF SCHEDULE 8 TO THE COMPANIES ACT 1985

We have examined the abbreviated financial statements on pages 4 to 6, together with the full financial statements of Q.S. Services (N.W.) Limited for the year ended 31st January 2006. The scope of our work for the purposes of this report was limited to confirming that the company is entitled to the exemptions claimed in the statement of the directors on page 4 and that the abbreviated financial statements have been properly prepared from the full financial statements.
