- 2) To provide educational courses and such cookery for the benefit of the community
- To develop educational courses for ethnic minority speciality foods carefully designed to meet government stand

Organisation

The members meet monthly The day to day management of FACET is delegated to the Director, Company Secretary and the TREASURER who meet regularly. All major decisions are taken at the monthly Board Meeting

Review of Activities and future developments

Throughout 2006 FACET continued to enjoy the support of its funder the Local Network Fund. Their financial support was all expended on charitable activities. Both the Director and Trustees have made much effort to develop culturally relevant curriculum and to implement these innovative ideas. We were able to experiment with some resource materials, and temporary learning support staff, and one instructor. Two weekly workshops for twenty one weeks and ONE DAY workshops in three schools with learning support staff instructor. All these human resources were outsourced. As a result 800 children from four schools in extended assemblies attended, and some actively took part in the cookery and demonstration sessions and were able to develop and celebrate a range of achievements. Feedback from teachers, parents and pupils were encouraging

Financial Report

Introduction

The trustees present their report and financial statements for the year ended 30 September 2006

Foods of Africa and Caribbean Educational Trust (FACET) is an educational, charitable company established in June 2005 FACET promotes the long term education and well being of people of all race and backgrounds by offering them efficient and flexible programme of first hand learning using its diverse and versatile foods and nutrition as tools. These are integrated with other aspects of academic and experimental learning.

In the year up to 30 September 2006 the Trust trailed its innovative concepts through the following

- Three workshops in which groups of Key Stage 2 & 3 pupils used all the
 five senses to cook, create art, learn history, geography, language skills,
 including a bit of maths and Science as the project sought to demonstrate
 measurable effects of healthy eating on educational performance.
- We resourced individuals and groups with ethnic materials to develop the intercultural understanding, personal and interpersonal skills at cookery workshops and eating in social settings.
- Shared our knowledge and capability with Learning Support and Ethnic Minority Achievement Grants teachers, focusing on African and Caribbean foods
- Offered reliable and balanced information and advice on ethnic and 'mainstream' healthy eating to local people in three deprived areas of Wandsworth, London

The year 2005/2006 has seen FACET demonstrate its role in diverse community, working with people of diverse religious and cultural backgrounds

Three of the five trustees have been recruited through voluntary sector groups and faith communities groups by advertisement and word of mouth. Furthermore, the Independent Monitoring and Performance Group (OIMPG) consisting of local owner managers have voluntarily worked with the Trust to ensure all donor funds contribute to well planned, appropriate designed projects, and that they are deliverable to service users. This again demonstrates that the Trust is transparent and reaches out to engage with local community.

Statement of Financial Activities:

During 2006, the income from grants funded totalled £7120(£11500-2005) We had only one Organisation that funded the FACET. Our local funder Local Network Fund

This was a reduction of more than 37% over the prior year. We received no other income. There was also a reduction in expenditure at the same rate.

Project costs matched the income and a report to Local Network Fund to account for the disbursement of the fund was accepted and was in compliance with their requirements, hence we continue a healthy relationship for future projects.

The Charity had no employees during 2006 No trustee or any person connected to them was paid any remuneration or claimed expenses during the year (2005 Nil).

Funds Statement:

The Designated Fund was only for the project funded by Local Network Fund There were no Capital Funds, Restricted or Unrestricted during the year

Grant Making Policy

There were no grants paid to any societies

Reserves Policy

The 2005/2006 plan envisages capital and revenue expenditure subject to securing more funding. The reserves policy hinges much on future funding.
