YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2011

The Directors have pleasure in submitting the Report and Accounts for the year

Objects of the charity

The object of the Charity is to carry out, provide and develop cross-cultural mission training and facilitate Christian organisations and believers into cross-cultural mission

Government

The policy and operating decisions of the charity rest with the Directors who meet regularly to monitor the activities of the company

Review of Activities

ACTS 13 continue to develop and facilitate cross-cultural mission training and encouragement amongst organisations, churches and individuals all across London, the United Kingdom and Europe The vast majority of funding for training and consultation has come through partner organisations through the provision of air and rail tickets and housing for Lab participants

Training and Consultation

Over the past year, consultations, speaking and training have been facilitated and offered through the following partners. Pioneer Fellowship, Greater Europe Mission, based in Germany and the International Board (with a world-wide focus), as well as through individual churches in London - England, Germany, Switzerland and the United States. On average, ACTS 13 personnel have been involved in training and consultation on two or three occasions each month through this reporting period. Most opportunities have taken place in Basel (and the border area of Switzerland and Germany), but also in London, Kiev, Ukraine, and Prague, The Czech Republic. During this reporting year, ACTS 13 personnel also attended a consultation held in Singapore involving cross-cultural communication trainers from around the world. ACTS 13 training notes continue to be translated into German, Dutch and Russian.

Report on New Developments:

Due to employment responsibilities, Stephen and Barbara James, lead trainers for ACTS 13, will continue to base out of Basel until the summer of 2012 at which time they plan a return to London Training and consultation will also continue to be carried out in London However, expansion of the Charity continues with plans underway to train other trainers who will carry out ACTS 13 and London Lab initiatives in multiple cities throughout Western, Central and Eastern Europe

The Coming Year

ACTS 13 Labs will continue in the next year at a rate of about one each month. It is important to note however, that these Labs will expand in the coming year to Graz, Austria, Sydney, Australia, Bonn, Germany, Rejkjavik, Iceland, and perhaps one or two other cities. Plans to train co-trainers who will carry out ACTS 13 Labs in various cities across Europe continue apace, with training now being undertaken in Kiev, Ukraine solely by co-trainers. Other training and consultations continue with Pioneer Fellowship in London, the USA-based International Board, Greater Europe Mission in Kandern, Germany, the Bonn Bible School in Germany, and with local churches in the UK and Germany.

Financial Review

Income for the year was £986 and expenditure in the year was £1189, giving a net deficit for the year of £202 compared with a deficit in the previous year of £254. Funds balances at year end totalled £1,993. Low amounts of expenditure and income for ACTS 13 do not, on the surface, reflect the widespread activity of the charity. The reasons for this are primarily associated with the fact that the expenses of training and other activities carried out on behalf of ACTS 13, are almost exclusively paid for by the inviting or contracting party. This means that the funds associated with training (airfare, train, office supplies, food, housing, etc.) are paid directly to vendors by ACTS 13 partners.

Reserves Policy

Given that the company has no monthly committed expenditure, the Directors have formed the view that a general reserve of £1,000 is an appropriate level for the time being

Risk Statement

The Directors have reviewed the risks to which a small charity operating without employees is exposed. Appropriate procedures are in place to identify, monitor and review these risks on a regular basis.

Directors' Responsibilities

Company law requires us as Directors to prepare financial statements for each accounting year which give a true and fair view of the state of the company and of its income and expenditure for the year

We are required to

- 1 Select suitable accounting policies and apply them consistently
- 2 Make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent

We are responsible for keeping adequate accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and enable us to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006

We also have a responsibility to safeguard the assets of the charity and to take reasonable steps to prevent fraud or any other irregularities

1 Accounting Policies

The accounts have been prepared under the historic cost convention, in accordance with applicable accounting standards and follow the Statement of Recommended Practice Accounting by Charities 2005 The following are the accounting policies which have been applied in dealing with material items -

a) Donated and grant income

Donated income and grants receivable are taken into account when received by the charity income received in circumstances where a claim for repayment of tax has been or will be made to the HM Revenue & Customs is grossed up for the tax recoverable. Any amount of tax reclaimed from HM Revenue & Customs but not yet received is shown within the charity's debtors.

b) Other income and expenditure

Investment income is taken into account when receivable and expenditure, including irrecoverable VAT, when incurred by the charity, regardless of when payment is made. Grants payable are taken into account at the earlier of when they are paid or become constructive obligations. Grants for the support of missionaries are accounted for on the basis of support that relates to the financial year.

c) Funds

Unrestricted funds are donations and other income received or generated for the objects of the charity without specified purpose and are available for purposes as directed by the trustees Restricted funds are amounts received where the donor has specified the purpose for which it should be used

d) Taxation

The company is a registered charity and is exempt from taxation under the Income & Corporation Taxes Act

e) Cashflow statement

The company has taken advantage of the exemption provided by the Financial Reporting Standard 1 and has not prepared a Cash Flow Statement for the year

f) Foreign currency transactions

Foreign currency transactions during the period are translated at an average rate Balances at the end of the period are converted at the rate applicable on the last day of the period
