# Report of the directors for the year ended 31 December 2007

The directors present their report together with the audited financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2007

#### Results and dividends

The profit and loss account is set out on page 6 and shows the profit for the year

The directors do not recommend the payment of a dividend for the year (2006 - £Nil)

# Principal activities, review of business and future developments

The company's principal activity continues to be that of a holding company It's only trading subsidiary, Metallisation Limited, continued its principal trading activity of manufacturing thermal spray equipment and the distribution of thermal spray consumables

Despite continuing volatility in the cost of base metals, in particular zinc, and significant changes in the value of Sterling relative to the Euro and US Dollar, the group achieved a gross profit of 16 5% (2006 - 16 4%) on turnover of £9,029,477 which was little changed from the previous year (£9,011,643).

Shareholders' funds at 31 December 2007 stood at £952,694 compared to £605,558 at the previous year end The increase comprised of retained profits for the year of £167,260 and an unrealised surplus of £179,876 arising on the revaluation of a freehold property. During the year the company negotiated terms for the full and final settlement of all outstanding loan notes resulting in the release of a fixed charge on the freehold property and also the release of an unlimited guarantee provided by the single trading subsidiary company.

The structure of the group was simplified in 2007 by the placing into liquidation of Metallisation Industries Limited and its two dormant subsidiary companies. Immediately prior to its liquidation, the only tangible assets of Metallisation Industries Limited, being a freehold property and its equity investment in Metallisation Limited, were transferred to the parent company. The group structure now comprises the parent company, Metallisation Service Limited and a single trading subsidiary company, Metallisation Limited. The freehold property owned by Metallisation Service Limited is occupied by Metallisation Limited for which it pays a rental to Metallisation Service Limited.

# Principal risks and uncertainties

The principal risks facing the company continue to be that the significant increases and volatility in the price of base metals over the last 18 months, and recent step shifts in the value of Sterling relative to both the Euro and US Dollar, will change the nature of the markets served. The directors continue to believe that the key to continued success is diversity and therefore the company continues to invest in the development of a broad range of technologically advanced products capable of serving a wide range of industrial applications across the UK and many export territories

The directors also believe that the simplified group structure and strengthened balance sheet leave the company well placed to continue with its development plans should there be any downturn in global economic activity during the forthcoming year

# Report of the directors for the year ended 31 December 2007 (Continued)

#### Financial instruments

The company holds a long term bank loan which has been secured by a fixed charge against the value of its freehold property

The company's only trading subsidiary holds financial instruments to finance its operations and as a tool to manage currency exposure risks arising from its operations

In addition, various financial instruments such as trade debtors and trade creditors arise directly from the company's operations. The company performs credit checks for all significant customers and carries insurance policies to minimise bad debt risk.

Operations and working capital requirements are funded principally out of short term banking facilities and retained profits.

#### 1 Accounting policies

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and are in accordance with applicable accounting standards

The following principal accounting policies have been applied

#### Basis of consolidation

The consolidated financial statements incorporate the results of Metallisation Service Limited and all of its subsidiary undertakings as at 31 December 2007 using the acquisition or merger method of accounting as required. Where the acquisition method is used, the results of subsidiary undertakings are included from the date of acquisition.

#### **Turnover**

Turnover represents sales to external customers at invoiced amounts less value added tax

#### Depreciation

Depreciation is provided to write off the cost, less estimated residual values, of all tangible fixed assets, except freehold land, evenly over their expected useful lives It is calculated at the following rates

Freehold property
Plant and machinery
Motor vehicles

over 50 yearsover 4 to 10 yearsover 4 years

Fixtures & fittings

- over 3 to 10 years

# Valuation of investments

Investments held as fixed assets are stated at cost less any provision for impairment

# Stocks

Stocks are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value on an item by item basis. Cost is arrived at by reference to the direct costs incurred in bringing stocks to their present location and condition at the end of the year. Net realisable value is based on the estimated selling price less further costs expected to be incurred to completion and disposal. Provision is made for obsolete, slow-moving or defective items where appropriate

#### Foreign currency

Foreign currency transactions of individual companies are translated at the rates ruling when they occurred Foreign currency monetary assets and liabilities are translated at the rates ruling at the balance sheet dates. Any differences are taken to the profit and loss account

#### Financial Instruments

Details of the use of financial instruments by the company and its subsidiary undertakings are contained in note 25 to the financial statements

### 1 Accounting policies (continued)

### Deferred taxation

Deferred tax balances are recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed by the balance sheet date except that the recognition of deferred tax assets is limited to the extent that the group anticipates making sufficient taxable profits in the future to absorb the reversal of the underlying timing differences

Deferred tax balances are not discounted

#### Pension costs

The cost of providing pensions in respect of defined contribution schemes is charged to the profit and loss account when contributions become payable

All amounts due to the group's defined benefit scheme are fully provided for in the financial statements

#### Guarantees and warranties

Provision is made for the expected cost of maintenance under guarantees and warranties and other work in respect of products delivered and invoiced

#### Leasing commitments

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged against income on a straight-line basis over the lease term

#### Dividends

Equity dividends are recognised when they become legally payable. In the case of interim dividends to equity shareholders, this is when declared by the directors. In the case of final dividends, this is when approved by the shareholders at the annual general meeting.

#### 2 Turnover

Turnover is wholly attributable to the principal activity of the group.

The analysis of turnover by geographical market required by paragraph 55 of Schedule 4 of the Companies Act 1985 has not been provided as, in the opinion of the directors, such disclosure would be seriously prejudicial to the interests of the group

#### 25 Financial instruments

The company holds a long term bank loan which has been secured by a fixed charge against the value of its freehold property

The company's only trading subsidiary holds financial instruments to finance its operations and as a tool to manage currency exposure risks arising from its operations
