YEAR ENDED 31ST DECEMBER 2014

The Trustees are pleased to present their report together with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31st December 2014.

Objects of the charity

The objects of the charity are set out in the memorandum and articles of association.

Organisation and background

The charity is administered by its board of Trustees in accordance with the Articles of Association. For the year to 31st December 2014, the board comprised of the Trustees listed at page 2. The Trustees meet monthly either indoors during the winter or outdoors on trips from spring onwards.

The society was formed in 1980 to encourage the preservation and display of public transport vehicles from the North East of England with charitable status being gained in 2003.

The Trustees are grateful to all members for their financial support of the Trust during the year.

Running Aims

We will be carrying on with Heritage and museum work by supporting a number of cultural and informative events including charities, local historical societies etc and wherever possible expanding on these.

Premises Aims

As members will be aware, for a number of years we had been searching for our own premises. This search had been partially resolved thanks to the assistance of Sunderland City Council in identifying premises situated at Rainton Bridge adjacent to the A690. Unfortunately we recently received twenty eight days' notice period from Sunderland City Council to vacate the new buildings at Rainton Bridge that we had only just occupied, so the search goes on for more suitable premises to store and maintain our vehicles. In the meantime we are continually cleaning and upgrading our existing premises.

TRUSTEES REPORT

YEAR ENDED 31ST DECEMBER 2014

Future Developments

We will continue to maintain our seven roadworthy vehicles and hope to increase that number to nine in the near future. In addition to this we have several ongoing restoration projects. Our Routemaster (RML 2530) rally control/club shop/reception vehicle is earning its keep thanks to our Sales Team and generous donation of stock items and it is well worth the conversion. On the rally scene our annual events are well advertised and have been very popular with the general public and enthusiasts alike. Following recent negotiations with North Tyneside Council the annual Whitley Bay rally has been resurrected.

The Trust has been involved in some exciting negotiations with Beamish Museum concerning the future 1950's themed town area, which now has the backing of the Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF). The plans include a bus station and a bus depot and we will quite possibly be supplying vehicles to the museum that would have been operating in this decade. The negotiations include the completion of the restoration of one of our vehicles and a major complete restoration of another, so we are looking forward to a very productive new relationship.

YEAR ENDED 31ST DECEMBER 2014

1. Accounting Policies

The principal accounting policies are summarised below. The accounting policies have been applied consistently throughout the year.

(a) Basis of Accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008) and the Statements of Recommended Practice: Accounting and Reporting by Charities issued in March 2005.

(b) Fund Accounting

- Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity.
- Restricted funds are subjected to restrictions on their expenditure imposed by the donor.

(c) Incoming Resources

All incoming resources are included in statement of financial activities when the charity is entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income:

- Voluntary income is received by way of subscriptions, donations and gifts and is included in full in the Statement of Financial Activities when receivable.

(d) Resources Expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accruals basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure includes any VAT which cannot be fully recovered, and is reported as part of the expenditure to which it relates:

- Costs of generating funds comprise the costs associated with attracting voluntary income.
- Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by charity in the deliverance of it's activities and services for it's beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them.
- Governance costs include those costs associated with meeting the constitutional and statutory requirements of the charity and include the audit fees and costs linked to the strategic management of the charity.
- All costs are allocated between the expenditure categories of the SoFA on a basis designed to reflect the use of the resource. Costs relating to a particular activity are allocated directly, others are apportioned on an appropriate basis i.e.. floor areas, per capita or estimated usage as set out in Note 4.
