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## REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2017

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2017. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

#### **OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES**

#### **Mission Statement**

"Working together to help children succeed in all they do."

#### Aims and objectives

In determining the Charity's aims and objectives and planning our activities, the trustees have given careful consideration to the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit and in particular to its supplementary public benefit guidance on advancing education.

The aims of the charity are to support families in the local community and enhance the development and education of children under statutory school age by:

- Providing access to flexible and affordable high quality child-care and education in a safe and stimulating environment in the local area and beyond.
- Encouraging parents to understand and become involved in their child's development and learning.

The strategies employed to achieve the charity's objectives include:

- Involvement with local companies and maintaining links with community groups and other relevant agencies, including the volunteer network, to further develop the nursery facilities, building upon solid foundations and enhancing standards.
- Providing experience through quality activities using a wide variety of resources and environments to promote each individual child's development and learning in all areas.
- Enabling each child to become a confident individual, effective contributor, successful learner and responsible
- Offering child-care provision for 51 weeks of the year between 8am and 6pm.
- Committee members (trustees) voluntarily providing a management, advisory and supportive service and so making a significant contribution to the Charity's organisation, fund-raising and local profile.

## REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2017

#### **OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES**

#### Achievement and performance

This year has been a more settled one for the nursery, its staff and committee members. This year has shown the true strength, commitment, determination and team work of the staff and committee, with strong support from our parents resulting in us having a strong position from which to continue forward into 2018.

New tracking systems are working well to monitor and analyse various cohorts alongside individuals, key groups and whole rooms to ensure all children are making progress. All our staff know what stage children are at, and what they are working towards with plans to identify and target support for those children that need it.

We have implemented a programme for appraisals, development reviews and meetings for staff teams which has brought our teams closer together and ideas are shared for future improvements.

Committee members are now fully conversant with the Early Years Compliance Handbook and Early Years Welfare Requirements. Quarterly Nursery audits were implemented which are undertaken by a member of the committee to oversee all areas of business and ensure the nursery is meeting all statutory requirements. Committee members all now have an individual responsibility such as Finance, Fundraising, Health and Safety, Outdoor Provision, Safeguarding, Compliance and Staff Liaison.

During 2017 the staff completed an extensive range of training between them including Early Years Updates, Safeguarding, Manual Handling, EYFS, Prevent, Early Help Staffordshire, Foundation Degree, Level 2 training, Paediatric First Aid etc.

Staff also attend monthly team meetings and bi-monthly staff meetings. Senior staff also held monthly team meetings and Deputy and Manager met weekly.

The nursery continued to provide before and after school provision for pupils attending Landywood Primary School until July 2017, at which time the provision was taken over by Landywood Primary School and two staff were transitioned over to become employed by the school.

Parental contribution continues to play an important part in nursery life and has been invaluable to us through this year. Parents are asked to take part and contribute to their child's learning and development, interacting with staff to discuss and progress.

We introduced a new Website (www.nurseryhollylane.co.uk) which is more user friendly and information can be uploaded by senior staff to be a more interactive tool to engage with our current and prospective parents.

They are also key stakeholders in how the nursery continues to develop and interact with the local community. Our annual Sports Day was enjoyed by all children and their families, giving the nursery the opportunity to bring their community together whilst boosting fundraising levels. We also had a Charity Comedy Night which raised money to go towards our Garden Project.

## REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2017

#### FINANCIAL REVIEW

#### Financial position

The end of the year saw a satisfactory financial result. As we were on minimal numbers in our Nursery Class until September 2017, this was expected. This resulted in a reduction in our reserves over this period, which the trustees are now seeking to rebuild.

Net outgoing resources for the year were £20,246, of which £17,550 related to unrestricted funds and £2,696 related to restricted funds.

The balance on unrestricted reserves now stands at £23,806.

The principal funding sources were admission fees £177,244 and LEA Funding (free nursery places for 2, 3 & 4 year olds) £94,168.

#### Investment powers and policy

Under the Memorandum and Articles of Association, the charity has the power to invest in any way the trustees wish.

#### Reserves policy

It is the trustees' view that it is prudent to ensure that there are sufficient reserves to provide financial flexibility. The Trustees estimate that two months running costs of approximately £30,000 per month should be held in unrestricted reserves and they are working towards that goal. The balance on unrestricted reserves at 31 December 2017 was £23,806 and the Trustees are seeking to rebuild unrestricted reserves to the ideal level by means of annual operating surpluses.

## REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2017

#### **FUTURE PLANS**

Moving forward the Committee and Nursery Management will continue to monitor the nursery financial stability and re-build financial reserves for use in unforeseen circumstances as this has proved invaluable to us in this reporting period and given the nursery a buffer to our future sustainability.

The Committee will look to further their specific roles within the organisation to work more closely with the nursery team and build a solid, confident, informed and united approach to the future.

Think 2 funding continued to be offered and we will cater for children entitled to the Early Years Pupil Premium (EYPP). The nursery will continue to offer the 30 hours offer to all children from September 2017 who met the criteria.

We will continue Forest School sessions with Nursery Class and provide more guided outdoor activities with Early Explorers to make use of our Sensory and garden space. We are making plans to further improve the outdoor area with enhanced training and resources alongside further storage to make best use of the environment we have.

We do have plans for a Community Garden offering bespoke play area to our 2-year olds and to be used for other community groups such as Landywood Children's Centre and local families.

Staff are important to us and we will continue to deliver training and development to ensure that they have the necessary skills with which to continue providing the best possible care and guidance to the children we look after. We are looking into the possibility on using online learning journeys instead of our paper based ones that we currently use. This will enable parents to be interactive with their child's learning.

The Childcare and Education Manager will be attending local Manager Network meetings to link in with other settings to keep addressed of trends, ideas and provisions others make within our community that we can utilise, support and make use of. The Childcare and Education Manager will work closely with the Deputy Manager to increase her role within the nursery so that she can have some Supernumerary time to enable her to fulfil the Deputy Role more effectively.

Planned fundraising activities for 2018 include an Easter Egg Hunt, Sports Day, Christmas Tombola/Raffle.

Keeping the Nursery Mission Statement in mind "Working together to help children succeed in all they do", we will build upon relationships with parents and their involvement in children's learning and development and continue to improve the facility and resources we provide for the children, their families and the community.

#### STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

#### Governing document

Holly Lane Nursery Ltd is a company limited by guarantee governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association. It registered as a charity with the Charity Commission (no.1142728) on 5 July 2011.

Prior to this date, it operated under the charity number 1030436.

Anyone over the age of 18 can become a member of the Company and there are currently 11 members, each of whom agree to contribute £1 in the event of the charity winding up.

### Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

As set out in the Articles of Association the management committee consists of three officers, Chair, Secretary and Treasurer, and not less than two nor more than nine elected members along with no more than three members co-opted by the committee. Committee members are nominated and elected annually by the members of the charitable company attending the Autumn Annual General Meeting (AGM) and serve for a period of six years.

All members are circulated with invitations to nominate trustees prior to the AGM advising them of the retiring trustees and requesting nominations for the AGM.

## REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2017

#### STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

#### Organisational structure

The board of trustees administers the charity. The board meets regularly covering development, membership, finance and audit. A Nursery Manager is appointed by the trustees to manage the day to day operations of the charity. To facilitate effective operations, the Manager has delegated authority, within terms of delegation approved by the trustees, for operational matters including finance, employment and related activity.

#### Induction and training of new trustees

New trustees are provided with the Pre-school Alliance information pack, 'Guidance for Parents Managed Committees' that provides information on their legal obligations under charity and company law, the content of the Memorandum and Articles of Association, the committee and decision making processes, the business plan and recent financial performance of the charity. Trustees are encouraged to attend appropriate external training events where these will facilitate the undertaking of their role.

#### Wider network and related parties

The charity has a close relationship with local primary and secondary schools as well as FE colleges. We offer work experience opportunities to pupils at the secondary schools as well as longer placement for student attending relevant childcare training courses.

#### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2017

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

#### Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

#### Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

#### Governance costs

Include the costs of the preparation and examination of statutory accounts, the costs of trustee meetings and the cost of any legal advice to Trustees on governance or constitutional matters.

#### Goodwill

Goodwill, being the amount paid in connection with the acquisition of a business in 2007, is being amortised evenly over its estimated useful life of ten years.

#### Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Improvements to property

- 5% on cost

Fixtures and fittings

- 25% on reducing balance

Computer equipment

- 25% on reducing balance

#### **Taxation**

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

#### Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

#### Pension costs and other post-retirement benefits

The charitable company operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable to the charitable company's pension scheme are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities in the period to which they relate.
