The directors present their Report and Financial Statements for the year ended 31 December 2011

Principal Activity and review of business

The principal activity of LLP No 13 Limited ("the Company") is that of being a corporate member of Actis LLP. Under the terms of the Members' Agreement relating to Actis LLP, no profits of Actis LLP were allocated to the Company in the year ended 31 December 2011. On 19 December 2011 the Company acquired £64 (\$100) of the member's capital in Copper Partners LLP, no income has been generated from this investment. The Company has not undertaken any other activity and consequently has neither profit nor loss for the year therefore a profit and loss account has not been presented.

The Company was incorporated on 5 March 2004, with a share capital of 1 £1 ordinary share issued at par. Its registered office is, 2 More London Riverside, London, SE1 2JT.

Events occurring after Balance Sheet Date

On 1 January 2012 the company made a further investment in Actis LLP taking its total to £14,000.

Auditor

Pursuant to Section 487 of the Companies Act 2006, the auditors will be deemed to be reappointed and KPMG LLP will therefore continue in office.

Actis Limited, Actis Nominee Limited, Ronald Edward Bell and Paul William Owers held office as directors of the company for the full year.
