Notes

(forming part of the financial statements)

1 Accounting policies

The following accounting policies have been applied consistently in dealing with items which are considered material in relation to the financial statements.

Basis of preparation

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards.

Going concern

The directors have prepared the financial statements on a going concern basis, notwithstanding net current liabilities of £66,000, on the basis of an undertaking from the company's parent company to support the company for at least twelve months from the date of these financial statements and for the foreseeable future. The directors have also prepared trading and cash flow forecasts for the group for a period in excess of 12 months following the date of approval of these financial statements. The forecasts indicate appropriate cash and covenant headroom based upon the current facilities. On this basis the directors are of the opinion that the group and therefore the Company has adequate resources to trade in an orderly fashion for the foreseeable future and accordingly adopt the going concern basis in preparing these financial statements.

Fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less estimated residual value over its expected useful life, as follows:

Cash flow statement

The company is exempt from the requirement of FRS 1 to prepare a cash flow statement on the grounds of its size.

Taxation

The charge for taxation is based on the profit for the year and takes into account taxation deferred because of timing differences between the treatment of certain items for taxation and accounting purposes.

Deferred tax is recognised, without discounting, in respect of all timing differences between the treatment of certain items for taxation and accounting purposes which have arisen but not reversed by the balance sheet date, except as otherwise required by FRS 19.

Leases

Operating lease rentals are charged to the profit and loss account on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.

Foreign currencies

Transactions denominated in foreign currencies are translated into sterling and recorded at the rate of exchange ruling at the date of the transaction. Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated into Sterling at the rate of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date and the gains or losses on translation are included in the profit and loss account.

Dividends on shares presented within shareholders' funds

Dividends unpaid at the balance sheet date are only recognised as a liability at that date to the extent that they are appropriately authorised and are no longer at the discretion of the company. Unpaid dividends that do not meet these criteria are disclosed in the notes to the financial statements.

2 Turnover

Turnover, which excludes value added tax and discounts, represents the goods and services sold. For services, turnover is recognised over the performance period that the services provided relate to. Recurring sales turnover such as for music services is billed in advance, for periods up to one year. The element that does not relate to the current year is deferred on a time basis and shown within deferred income. Turnover on non-recurring items such as systems installations is only recognised when the installation is complete.

14 Contingent liabilities

The bank loans and overdrafts of the Imagesound Limited (formerly Imagesound plc) group have been secured via a cross guarantee between all companies within the group. At 31 December 2014 the amount outstanding on the group's facilities is £4,552,000 (2013: £2,775,000).

15 Related party transactions
