Structure, Governance and Management

Governing Document

The organisation is a charitable company limited by guarantee, not having a share capital and having obtained exemption under Section 60 of the Companies Act 2006 to dispense with the word limited as part of the company name. The company was incorporated on 29 April 2004 and registered as a charity on 25 July 2006.

The company was established under a Memorandum of Association which established the objectives and powers of the charitable company and is governed under its Articles of Association. In the event of the company being wound up, members are required to contribute an amount not exceeding £1.

Change of Name

On the 25 November 2009 the Arena in Ilkeston changed its name to Arena Community

Recruitment and Appointment of Management Committee

The directors of the company are also charity trustees for the purposes of Charity Law and under the company's Articles are known as members of the management committee. Under the requirements of the Memorandum and Articles of Association the members of the management committee are elected to serve for a period of two years after which they must be re-elected at the next Annual General Meeting.

Trustee Training

The trustees have served for a considerable period of time not only with this charity but are also involved with other charities as directors and trustees and are familiar with the practical work of this charity and their responsibilities as trustees

Risk Management

The trustees have examined the major strategic, business and operational risks which the charity faces and confirm that systems have been established to enable regular reports to be produced so that the necessary steps can be taken to lessen these risks

Organisational Structure

Arena Community has a board of three trustees They meet on a regular basis to review current issues and at these meetings decisions concerning the running of the charity are made. A full record of all meetings is kept

Public Benefit

The trustees have begun work within the community through the use of the charity shop to support local activities. The trustees confirm that they have complied with their duties under section 4 of the 2006 Charity Act with regard to public benefit.

Objectives and Activities

The Charity's objectives and principal activities are to develop the capacity and skills of the members of the socially and economically disadvantaged community of Ilkeston, Derbyshire, in such a way that they are better able to identify, and meet, their needs and to participate more fully in society

Related Party

Arena Community is a charitable company set up to support the work of its trading company known as Anera Enterprises Ltd of which it owns the whole of the share capital

The Arena Community also has links with Arena Church whose members and trustees support the work of the charity by way of donation and help

Achievements and Performance

Arena Community was set up by a group of people from many different professional backgrounds and gained charity status in July 2006. The purpose of the charity is to help, assist, educate and support local needs in the community.

It has been a good year for the charity as we opened our first charity shop. In August 2009 we obtained a property on a three year lease, which we fitted out and in September opened Arena Hope. We employed Sean Cumberland on a full time basis as the Charity Shop Manager, whose background is in retail. We have since employed David Crabtree to cover Sean's day off in the week and annual holidays. Sean has employed a team of volunteers to staff the shop. They do a variety of roles including sorting and preparing clothes and merchandise for sale and serving on the shop floor.

In November at the Christmas lights switch on at Ilkeston, we served free drinks and biscuits from the frontage, which was well received by the public

We had originally set up the layout to include a coffee shop area and in February 2010 this was opened. It is manned by paid staff from Anera Enterprises Ltd, as well as volunteers

The whole dynamics has worked very well and it is our intention to open more charity shops in other locations in the area

Financial Review

The attached financial statements show the current state of the finances The company had net incoming resources during the year of £25,253 The company's revenue general fund balance is a deficit of £(8,379) at 31 March 2010 there is a loan outstanding to Arena Church of £13,014 not due by any planned repayment date The company's deficit for the year totalled £(8,793) $(£1,882\ 2009)$

The Board of Trustees consider the current state of the company's finances to be sound

Reserves Policy

It is the policy of the trustees to build up and maintain unrestricted reserves of £10,000

Plans for the Future

Short Term Aims

Our aim was to launch a food bank in Ilkeston to help people who have no food on a short term basis. This has now happened. A portacabin has been purchased to house stocks of food and toiletries. The food bank is opened twice a week on a Tuesday and Friday and people in need will be supplied with a food parcel, as well as some basic toiletries, which will feed them for three days. We are working with various agencies in the town who will refer their clients who are in need of food.

We are working in partnership with Arena Church (charity 1052643) and are also looking to engage the support of other local charities, businesses and schools from within the community to help sustain and increase the impact of the food bank project

To open or at least have properties for two more charity shops during the financial year April 2010 – March 2011

Long Term Aims

To build up a portfolio of charity shops around the locality

To launch food banks from other locations within Ilkeston

To launch a food bank in Mansfield

Responsibilities of the Trustees

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

a) Basis of Accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, as modified by the inclusion of fixed asset investments at market value, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective June 2002), the Companies Act 2006 and the Statement of Recommended Practice Accounting and Reporting by Charities issued in March 2005

b) Incoming Resources

Represents charity shop sales, donations and Gift Aid reclaims All donations and sales are included in full in the Statement of Financial Activities when receivable. The value of services by volunteers has not been included in these accounts.

c) Resources Expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accruals basis as a liability is incurred

Expenditure includes VAT which is not recoverable

- Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be directly allocated to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them
- Governance costs include those costs associated with meeting the constitutional and statutory requirements of the charity and include fees and costs linked to the strategic management of the charity
- All costs are allocated between the expenditure categories of the SOFA on a basis designed to reflect the use of the resource

d) Interest Receivable

Interest is included when receivable by the Charity

Fund Accounting

Unrestricted Funds

Unrestricted funds are donations and other incoming resources receivable or generated for the objects of the charity without further specified purpose and are available as general funds

Designated Funds

Designated funds are unrestricted funds earmarked by the management committee for particular purposes

Restricted Funds

Restricted funds are to be used for specific purposes as laid down by the donor Expenditure, which meets these criteria, is charged to the fund, together with a fair allocation of management and support costs

Arena Community is a charitable company set up to support the work of its trading company known as Anera Enterprises Ltd of which it owns the whole share capital The charity operates from premises owned by Arena Church – the costs for this are not quantified

The charity shop opened on the 2nd August 2009 and has a three year lease, which is at a cost per annum of £9,360

11. Investment in subsidiary

The charity wholly owns a subsidiary Anera Enterprises Ltd and the charity holds the issued ordinary shares in the company representing 100% of the equity of the company. The principal activity of Anera Enterprise Ltd is the operation of a conference centre, room hire, events and coffee shops. A summary of the results of the subsidiary is shown below.
