PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES AND BUSINESS REVIEW

The principal activity of the company during the year was that of an investment company.

The company holds investments related to hospitality and leisure businesses. This includes Spa (Maurice) Limited which fully owns a Mauritian company investing in a luxury resort. The company also holds asset investments including Shanti Hospitality (UK) with a hotel in Edinburgh. In addition to hotel related activity, the company invested in to restaurant, food and beverage, Bunny Chow Limited, The company also owns land banks and hotels through its sub subsidiaries in India.

We have audited the financial statements of Shanti Hospitality Group Limited for the year ended 31 March 2015. The financial reporting framework that has been applied in their preparation is applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice).

RESPECTIVE RESPONSIBILITIES OF DIRECTORS AND AUDITOR

As explained more fully in the Directors' Responsibilities Statement set out on page 2, the directors are responsible for the preparation of the financial statements and for being satisfied that they give a true and fair view. Our responsibility is to audit and express an opinion on the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and International Standards on Auditing (UK and Ireland). Those standards require us to comply with the Auditing Practices Board's Ethical Standards for Auditors.

SCOPE OF THE AUDIT OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

An audit involves obtaining evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements sufficient to give reasonable assurance that the financial statements are free from material misstatement, whether caused by fraud or error. This includes an assessment of: whether the accounting policies are appropriate to the company's circumstances and have been consistently applied and adequately disclosed; the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by the directors; and the overall presentation of the financial statements. In addition, we read all the financial and non-financial information in the annual report to identify material inconsistencies with the audited financial statements and to identify any information that is apparently materially incorrect based on, or materially inconsistent with, the knowledge acquired by us in the course of performing the audit. If we become aware of any apparent material misstatements or inconsistencies we consider the implications for our report.

OPINION ON FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

In our opinion the financial statements:

- have been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Companies Act 2006.

EMPHASIS OF MATTER

Without qualifying our opinion we draw to your attention Note 2 to the financial statements which indicates the Company's ability to continue as a going concern. As detailed in note 2 to the financial statements, Company's ability to continue as a going concern is dependent upon the long term success of the Company's underlying investments in subsidiary undertakings and in the short term is dependent upon the continuing support of the shareholder and ultimate parent company. The financial statements do not include any adjustments if the going concern basis is no longer appropriate. Without qualifying our opinion we would also draw to your attention the recoverability of an amount of £25,023,972 (2014 £34,501,061) included in investments (see note 7), due from the company's subsidiary, Spa (Maurice) Limited. Spa (Maurice) Limited has used these funds to make a loan to their 100% subsidiary, Spa on the Shores Limited, which owns a 5 star luxury hotel known as, Shanti Maurice. Both companies are registered in Mauritius. The directors have assessed the recoverability of the loan to Spa on the Shores Limited and they believe that the full amount will be recoverable and hence no impairment charge is deemed necessary in either the financial statements of Spa (Maurice) Limited or in these financial statements. The financial statements do not included any adjustments that would be deemed necessary if the loan of £25,023,972 (2014 - £34,501,061) becomes impaired.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with applicable UK accounting standards.

Consolidation

The company was, at the end of the year, a wholly-owned subsidiary of another company incorporated in the EEA and in accordance with Section 400 of the Companies Act 2006, is not required to produce, and has not published, consolidated accounts.

Turnover

Turnover represents the amounts receivable, excluding VAT, by the company for goods supplied and services provided during the year.

Fixed assets

All fixed assets are initially recorded at cost.

Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated so as to write off the cost of an asset, less its estimated residual value, over the useful economic life of that asset as follows:

Equipment

10%-33% straight line

Operating lease agreements

Rentals applicable to operating leases where substantially all of the benefits and risks of ownership remain with the lessor are charged against profits on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.

Foreign currencies

Assets and liabilities in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rates of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. Transactions in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rate of exchange ruling at the date of the transaction. Exchange differences are taken into account in arriving at the operation profit.

The Company has made loans to its investments undertakings. These loans have been made on a long term basis and are included as part of the carrying value of the investment. In April 2012, loan agreements were formalised in connection with these loans and the loans have been formalised in foreign currencies. As a result, the Company has started to convert these loans to sterling at the exchange rates prevailing at the balance sheet date in accordance with SSAP20. Unrealised exchange gains and losses in respect of the movement in foreign currency are recognised in the Company's profit and loss account for the year.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

Financial instruments

Financial instruments are classified and accounted for, according to the substance of the contractual arrangement, as either financial assets, financial liabilities or equity instruments. An equity instrument is any contract that evidences a residual interest in the assets of the company after deducting all of its liabilities.

2. GOING CONCERN

The accounts have been prepared on a going concern basis which is dependent upon both the continuing support of other member of the C&C Alpha group and on the success of the company's subsidiaries. The directors have confirmed that they are confident that the company's subsidiaries will be a success and that the hotels owned by the subsidiaries will generate future income sufficient to recover the monies advanced to them.

The company also owns 100% of the issued share capital of Shanti Hotel Ventures Limited, Shanti Prime Hotels Limited, Amritara Holdings Limited and Nidra Holdings Limited, all companies registered in Mauritius, company also owns 100% share capital of Shanti Hospitality (UK) Limited, a company registered in England and Wales, 75% share capital of H Hotel Global Limited a company registered in England and Wales, 100% share capital of Shanti Hospitality (US) Inc a company registered in Delaware, 100% share capital of Shanti Hospitality II (US) Inc a company registered in Delaware and 100% share capital of Alpine Hospitality (Switzerland) AG a company registered in Switzerland. The company also owns 100% of share capital of Spa Hospitality Limited, a company registered in Mauritius, 100% of share capital of Bunny Chow Limited, a company registered in England & Wales, 100% share capital of Restaurant Kama Limited, a company registered in England & Wales, 100% share capital of Urubamba Private Limited a company registered in England & Wales and 50% share capital of Street Dots Limited a company registered in England & Wales.

All loans to subsidiaries are considered to be long term loans and the recoverability of these loans is dependent upon the future success of the investments. No adjustments have been made to the financial statements should the investments be unsuccessful.
