# 1. Accounting policies

The following accounting policies have been applied consistently in dealing with the items which are considered material in relation to the company's financial statements.

### Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost accounting rules and in accordance with applicable Accounting Standards.

The financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis which the directors believe to be appropriate for the following reasons. The principal activity of the company is to hold investments in projects under the government sponsored Local Improvement Finance Trust (LIFT) initiative. The company earns interest on its investment throughout the life of the project and this is rolled up in an intercompany account. The company is dependent for its working capital on funds provided to it by Miller Corporate Holdings Limited, the company's immediate parent. Miller Corporate Holdings Limited has indicated that for at least 12 months from the date of approval of these financial statements, it will continue to make available such funds as are needed by the company and in particular will not seek repayment of the amounts currently made available. The directors consider that this should enable the company to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future by meeting its liabilities as they fall due for payment. As with any company placing reliance on other group entities for financial support, the directors acknowledge that there can be no certainty that this support will continue although, at the date of approval of these financial statements, they have no reason to believe that it will not do so.

Accordingly, the directors of the company continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the annual financial statements.

As permitted by Section 228 of the Companies Act 1985, the company has not prepared consolidated accounts. The group accounts of The Miller Group Limited consolidate the results of the company and its subsidiary undertakings.

The company is exempt from the requirement of Financial Reporting Standard 1, to prepare a cash flow statement, as it is a wholly owned subsidiary of The Miller Group Limited and its cash flows are included within the consolidated cash flow statement of that company.

As the company is a wholly owned subsidiary of The Miller Group Limited, the company has taken advantage of the exemption contained in Financial Reporting Standard 8 and has therefore not disclosed transactions or balances with entities which form part of the group. The consolidated financial statements of The Miller Group Limited, within which this company is included, can be obtained from the address given in note 14.

#### Investments

Fixed asset investments are shown at cost less provision for impairment.

#### **Taxation**

The charge for taxation is based on the profit for the year and takes into account taxation deferred or accelerated because of timing differences between the treatment of certain items for taxation and accounting purposes.

Deferred tax is recognised, without discounting, in respect of all timing differences between the treatment of certain items for taxation and accounting purposes which have a risen but not reversed by the balance sheet date, except as otherwise required by FRS 19.
