PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES AND REVIEW OF BUSINESS

The principal activities of the company continued to be that of providing integrated facilities management ("FM") services to the public and infrastructure sectors

Our priority in the year was to reinforce our position in the market as a leading deliverer of FM Services in our chosen sectors, this has been successfully underpinned by expansion and consolidation into more sub-sectors, eg central government, further and higher education and non-acute health and by organically growing the spread and longevity of existing relationships

This has been a challenging year for many of our clients with demand for services set against increasing pressure for cost reductions. We have seized the opportunity to support our clients pro-actively and provide flexible and added value services to support their changing needs.

Our market reputation has grown through consistency and quality of service and in certainty of outcomes for clients. Our market presence has been enhanced through our engagement with policy makers, key influencers, industry experts and industry media.

Our continued high performance operational delivery on sites and reputation for quality has been reinforced by the continued implementation of our strategy of delivering key front line services internally

GOING CONCERN

PRINCIPAL RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The services provided by the company present limited operational risks and these are mitigated through a comprehensive risk management process. The majority of our activities are delivered through long term contracts which are structured to limit the company's exposure to commercial risks. The principal uncertainties with regard to the company's ability to continue to achieve its current level of profitability are the loss of a major client and general economic and market conditions. The company has a diverse client base and the loss of any particular client would not have a catastrophic impact on the company's viability. The trading performance in 2012 demonstrates the company's ability to perform strongly during adverse economic conditions.

FUTURE OUTLOOK

The future outlook is positive We expect to meet our growth targets, offer innovative solutions based on the quality of both staff and systems and successfully operate in a competitive market

The company has produced strong growth over the last two years and the directors believe this will continue in 2013. The company is working on new opportunities, a number of which are expected to be secured in 2013.

FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS

The company's principal financial instruments comprise bank balances, trade debtors and trade creditors. The main purpose of these instruments is to finance the company's operations.

Due to the nature of the financial instruments used by the company there is no exposure to price risk. The company's approach to managing other risks applicable to the financial instruments concerned is shown below

In respect of bank balances the company makes use of money market facilities when funds are available

Trade debtors are managed in respect of credit and cash flow risk by application of policies regarding the credit offered to customers, and the regular monitoring of amounts outstanding with reference to time and credit limits

Trade creditors liquidity risk is managed by ensuring sufficient funds are available to meet amounts falling due to the appropriate time

EMPLOYEE INVOLVEMENT

The company s policy is to consult and discuss with employees, through unions, staff councils, and at meetings, matters likely to affect employees' interests

Information on matters of concern to employees is given through information bulletins and reports which seek to achieve a common awareness on the part of all employees of the financial and economic factors affecting the company's performance

DISABLED PERSONS

The company s policy is to recruit disabled workers for those vacancies that they are able to fill. All necessary assistance with initial training courses is given. Once employed, a career plan is developed so as to ensure suitable opportunities for each disabled person. NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS Year ended 31 December 2012

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The principal accounting policies are summarised below. They have all been applied consistently throughout the year and the preceding year.

Accounting convention

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention

The company has taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No 1 (Revised 1996) from the requirement to produce a cash flow statement on the grounds that it is a subsidiary undertaking where 90 percent or more of the voting rights are controlled within the group

Compliance with accounting standards

The financial statements are prepared in accordance with applicable United Kingdom Accounting standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice), which have been applied consistently (except as otherwise stated)

Going concern

When considering going concern the directors consider the company's business activities, together with the factors likely to affect its future development, performance and position. As noted in this review, the directors view the future outlook of the company as positive

The company meets its day to day working capital requirements through its own working capital and also intra group funding within the Europa Support Services Limited group ('Group')

In carrying out their duties in respect of going concern, the directors have carried out a review of the company's and Group's financial position and eash flow forecast for 12 months from the date of signing the financial statements. This has been based on a comprehensive review of revenue, expenditure and eash flows, incorporating specific business risks and the uncertainties brought about by the current economic environment.

At the year end, the Group had a net cash balance of £4 4m (2011 £4 9m) and net funds of £1 2m (2011 £0 3m) In addition, in April 2013, the Group secured new banking facilities with HSBC, which consists of a £10 0 million revolving credit facility at 2 0% interest above LIBOR, repayable March 2017 Within this £10 0 million revolving credit facility is a £2 0 million overdraft facility renewable after 12 months

The company s and Group's forecasts and projections, taking account of reasonably possible changes in trading performance, show that the company should be able to operate within the level of its current resources and facilities, including on-going compliance with the covenants attached to the Group's bank facilities over the period discussed above

Having taken all of the above factors into consideration, the directors have reached a conclusion that the company is able to manage its business risks despite the current uncertain economic outlook. Accordingly, they continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the annual report and accounts

Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows

Plant and machinery

Rates varying from 20% - 33% straight line basis

Fixtures, fittings & equipment

Rates vary from 20% - 50% straight line basis

Motor vehicles

50% straight line basis

Leasing

Rentals payable under operating leases are charged against income on a straight line basis over the lease term

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

Turnover recognition

Turnover is generally recognised as contract activity progresses so that for incomplete contracts it reflects the partial performance of the contractual obligations. For such contracts the amount of revenue reflects the accrual of the right to consideration by reference to the value of work performed. Turnover not billed to clients is included in debtors and payments on account in excess of the relevant amount of revenue are included in creditors.

Pensions

The company operates a defined benefit pension scheme The scheme has been closed to future accrual except for a number of employees of Europa Facility services Limited who provide services to the company

Pension costs are assessed using the projected unit credit method, the cost of providing pensions is charged to the profit and loss account so as to spread the regular costs over the service lives of employees. The pension obligation is measured at the present value of the estimated future cash flows using interest rates on government securities that have terms to maturity approximating the terms of the related liability. The actuarial valuations are obtained at least triennially and are updated at each balance sheet date. The amounts charged to operating profit are the current service costs and gains and losses on settlements and curtailments. These are included as part of operating costs. The interest cost and the expected return on assets are shown as a net amount of other finance costs or credits adjacent to interest. Actuarial gains and losses are recognised immediately in the statement of total recognised gains and losses.

When the benefits of a scheme are improved, past service costs is recognised as an expense on a straight-line basis over the average period until the benefits become vested. To the extent that the benefits are already vested immediately, following the introduction of, or changes to, a defined benefit plan, the past service cost is recognised as an expense immediately.

Cash flow

The company is a wholly owned subsidiary of Europa Support Services Limited which prepares a publicly available consolidated cash flow statement. As such the company is exempt from the preparation of a cash flow statement.

Taxation

Current tax is provided at amounts expected to be paid (or recovered) using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date where transactions or events that result in an obligation to pay more tax in the future or a right to pay less tax in the future have occurred at the balance sheet date. Timing differences are differences between the company's taxable profits and its results as stated in the financial statements that arise from the inclusion of gains and losses in tax assessments in periods different from those in which they are recognised in the financial statements.

A net deferred tax asset is regarded as recoverable and therefore recognised only to the extent that, on the basis of all available evidence, it can be regarded as more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing differences can be deducted

Deferred tax is measured at the average tax rates that are expected to apply in the periods in which the timing differences are expected to reverse, based on tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date. Deferred tax is measured on a non-discounted basis

2. TURNOVER

The total turnover of the company for the year has been derived from its principal activity wholly undertaken in the United Kingdom

The company employs a building block approach in determining the long-term rate of return on pension plan assets. The underlying mortality assumption for pensions in payment are based upon the standard tables known as PA92 with 50% medium and 50% long cohort future improvement factors subject to a minimum underpin improvement in mortality rates at every age of 1 25% pa. The final liability values have been reduced by 6 5%. There are separate tables for men and women. Before retirement no mortality has been assumed.
