#### 1 Accounting policies

The following accounting policies have been applied consistently in dealing with items which are considered material in relation to the financial statements

#### Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice) and under the historical cost accounting rules

The company has taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No 1 (Revised 1996) from the requirement to produce a cash flow statement on the grounds of its size

#### Going concern

After making enquiries, the directors have a reasonable expectation that the company has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. For this reason, they continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the financial statements.

#### Foreign currency translation

Monetary assets and habilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rates of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. Transactions in foreign currencies are recorded at the rate ruling at the date of the transaction. All differences are taken to the profit and loss account.

#### Taxation

Deferred taxation is provided in full in respect of taxation deferred by timing differences between the treatment of certain items for taxation and accounting purposes. The deferred tax balance has not been discounted

#### Turnover

#### Factors that may affect future current and total tax charges

On 23 March 2011 the Chancellor announced that the main rate of UK corporation tax will reduce from 28% to 26% with effect from 1 April 2011. This tax change became substantively enacted on 29 March 2011. A further reduction in the main rate of UK corporation tax to 25% per cent will take effect from 1 April 2012. This change became substantively enacted on 5 July 2011 and therefore the effect of the rate reduction on the deferred tax balances as at 31 December 2011 has been included in the figures above

The Chancellor also proposed changes to further reduce the main rate of corporation tax by one per cent per annum to 23% by I April 2014, but these changes have not yet been substantively enacted and therefore are not included in the figures above
