NOTES TO THE ABBREVIATED ACCOUNTS

PERIOD FROM 1 APRIL 2012 TO 31 DECEMBER 2012

1. Accounting policies

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with applicable accounting standards

Cash flow statement

The directors have taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No 1 (Revised 1996) from including a cash flow statement in the financial statements on the grounds that the company is small

Deferred taxation

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date where transactions or events have occurred at that date that will result in an obligation to pay more tax, or a right to pay less tax, or a right to receive repayments of tax

Deferred tax assets are recognised only to the extent that the directors consider it more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing differences can be deducted. Deferred tax assets and liabilities recognised have not been discounted.

Deferred tax is measured on a non-discounted basis at the average tax rates that are expected to apply in the periods in which timing differences reverse, based on tax rates and laws enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date

Financial instruments

Financial instruments are classified and accounted for as financial assets, financial liabilities or equity instruments, according to the substance of the contractual arrangement

Financial instruments which are assets are stated at cost less any provision for impairment Financial liabilities are stated at principal capital amounts outstanding at the period end. Issue costs relating to financial liabilities are deducted from the outstanding balance and are amortised over the period to the due date for repayment of the financial liability.

An equity instrument is any contract that evidences a residual interest in the assets of the company after deducting all of its liabilities. A financial liability is any contractual arrangement for an entity to deliver cash to the holder of the associated financial instrument.

If a financial instrument contains both an equity and a liability element, then the liability element is first established with any residual value being disclosed within equity shareholders' funds. The liability element is the present value of the future payments guaranteed to be made to the holders of the financial instrument.

Investments

Investments in subsidiaries are included in the financial statements at cost plus incidental expenses less any provision for impairment. Impairment reviews are performed by the directors when there has been an indication of impairment.

On 1 February 2013, the entire share capital of Riverside Topco Limited was purchased by VCS (Holdings UK) Limited On this date, the ultimate controlling party of the company became Coaxis Inc. by virtue of their ownership of VCS (Holdings UK) Limited and in turn Riverside Topco Limited

The acquisition has had no immediate financial impact on 4Projects Holdings Limited

6 Ultimate controlling party

At 31 December 2012, the company's immediate parent company was Riverside Acquisitions Limited and the ultimate parent company was Riverside Topco Limited

In the opinion of the directors, at 31 December 2012 there was no ultimate controlling party of the company as no individual had control of more than 50% of the share capital of Riverside Topco Limited On 1 February 2013 the entire share capital of Riverside Topco Limited was purchased by VCS (Holdings UK) Limited which has resulted in a change in control.
