Principal activities of the company in the course of the year

During this past year we have been open for 26 Saturdays from 1-45pm until 3-45pm for Contact parents to visit their children

In actual fact our 15 volunteers, on a 6 weekly rota, arrive at 1-00pm to set the room out with the various toys and games. We provide tea and coffee facilities for parents and soft drinks for the children. After clearing the room afterwards it is usually about 4-00pm before we lock up! We have a great bunch of volunteers who are really committed and provide such a happy atmosphere for these families.

This year we have had 28 different families coming through our doors and we are pleased to report that the majority of them have happy endings in that they can have contact with their children without our involvement. It seems strange that Child Contact Centres can judge their success by the number of families that leave to become independent! We have received evaluation forms back from parents about their sessions with us and have received very good positive feedback.

In compliance with the National Association of Child Contact Centres we have 3 training session per year for the volunteers and also 2 Committee Meetings where we discuss the business of the Centre and also our "families" We then report back to the Bingley Beacon Project and invite them to our meetings and also invite them to attend any of our sessions

We have been very fortunate this year to receive a grant from the National Lottery Fund amounting to £1,711. This has greatly helped our financial situation allowing us to buy more toys for both older children and younger ones. This has helped us with the day to day running costs of insurance and the Post Office Mail Box, as well as the ever rising telephone services. This year we have gone through our accreditation process and two volunteers have been on a training course. We have also received financial help from the Bingley Rotary and the Samuel Sunderland Relief Fund for Bingley Charities.

We really appreciate the facilities we have and thank Bingley Baptist Church for allowing us to use their premises, free of charge. Our thanks also go to the board of the Bingley Beacon Project for their support and funding

1 Accounting policies

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice. Accounting and Reporting by Charities (SORP 2005), the Companies Act 2006 and Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008). The directors consider that whilst the company is not a registered charity, the SORP format is appropriate for reporting the activities of the company.

There has been no change to the accounting policies since last year No changes have been made to the accounts for previous years

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the SOFA when the company becomes entitled to the resources, the directors are virtually certain they will receive the resources and the monetary value can be measured with sufficient reliability

Grants and donations

Grants and donations are only included in the SOFA when the company has unconditional entitlement to the resources

Where grants are related to performance and specific deliverables, they are accounted for as the company earns the right to consideration by its performance

Expenditure and liabilities

Expenditure is recognised on an accrual basis as a liability is incurred. Liabilities are recognised as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to pay out the resources

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the directors in furtherance of the general objectives of the company

Restricted funds are subjected to restrictions on their expenditure imposed by the donor or through the terms of an appeal
