TRUSTEES' REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 AUGUST 2013

The Trustees, (who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act) present their Trustees' Report and the financial statements of The Millington Road Nursery School Trust (the Charity) for the year ended 31 August 2013. The Trustees confirm that the Trustees' Report and financial statements of the Charity comply with current statutory requirements, the requirements of the Charity's governing document and the provisions for smaller charities in appendix 5 of the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" issued in March 2005.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

The Charity is registered as a company limited by guarantee and is governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association dated 15 February 2005, amended by a special resolution dated 25 March 2007 Charitable status was obtained on 7 February 2008. The assets and activities of the charity known as The Millington Road Nursery School Trust (charity registration number 300373) were transferred to the new incorporated charity on 31 August 2008. OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

The Charity was formed to carry on the Millington Road Nursery School and to promote the advancement of education

The number of children attending the Nursery in Summer 2013 was 73 (2012 65)

The Trustees are aware of the Charity Commission guidance on public benefit and their operation of the Nursery School reflects this in the following ways

- a) The Nursery is a partner in the government's Early Years Foundation Stage Programme and parents of children in their pre-school year can obtain a grant to cover all of the cost of up to fifteen hours a week. This has now been extended to include funded two-year-olds from referred families.
- b) The Nursery supports the education and training of future childcare providers by the provision of work experience placements for students, school leavers and on occasion Duke of Edinburgh Award trainees
- c) Being mindful of its charitable status, the Nursery maintains its fees at as low a level as possible to cover its running costs
- d) The Trustees provide their professional skills and services as unpaid volunteers in order to retain fees at a minimum

TRUSTEES' REPORT (continued) FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 AUGUST 2013

- e) The Nursery has always received children from many different nationalities whose parents are currently working or studying in Cambridge It makes every effort to communicate with these children in their own language and to acknowledge various festivals from around the world as part of the curriculum
- f) The Nursery has achieved an Eco School SILVER certificate for following environmentally friendly policies in the school and promoting their wider use in the community. In Spring 2013 it was proud to be awarded the higher Green Flag status, the only nursery school in the area to achieve this
- g) The Nursery involves itself in the neighbouring community by attending meetings of the Residents' Association, inviting residents to attend special events and maintaining links with the local establishments such as churches, shops, schools, playgroups, the toddler group and children's centre

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

Review of activities

The Nursery has had a very successful year, as is reflected in the increased numbers of children attending and on the waiting list. Fluctuations in numbers are, however, inevitable in view of unpredictable numbers of local children and visiting academics.

Its policy of free choice between indoor and outdoor play makes full use of the secluded natural garden and covered area which is used for a wide range of activities. Many children spend much of their time in the garden and all are encouraged to be outside for some of the time.

Using the Anniversary Garden Fund the garden was redesigned by Alice Willetts of Willow & Wren and the plans were carried out during the summer holidays 2013. They include a tree house, mud kitchen, new sandpit, aromatic garden and rocky climbing hillock, all of which are much enjoyed by staff and children.

The Summer Club is run for a two week period after the close of the summer term, and is very popular with parents and children, as well as being financially viable and generating a small surplus towards general running costs

A high proportion of the staff are engaged in further professional training. The Principal has been awarded a BA honours degree in Children and Early Childhood and has been awarded Early Years Professional Status. Two other members of staff are taking degree courses. The nursery also employs an Early Years Professional, in line with government policy for nursery school practitioners.

Organisation

Throughout the period of the Financial Statements the day to day affairs of the nursery school were run by Mrs Mary Field who has been the School Principal from 1 September 2004. During a period of ill health this year her place was taken at the Nursery by Mrs Lena Pimm, a Senior member of staff with Early Years Professional Status but Mrs Field remained in overall control and returned to full-time work towards the end of the summer term

Inspections

The Nursery School received an inspection by OFSTED in June 2009. The outcome was very favourable and the report was particularly complimentary about the quality of teaching, the quality of care and the facilities at the school.

TRUSTEES' REPORT (continued) FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 AUGUST 2013

Premises

The Charity occupies premises known as Millington Road Nursery School owned by the Provost and Scholars of King's College, Cambridge Until 28 September 2002, the premises were occupied rent-free. The rent now charged by the landlord is £9,000 per annum, all payable quarterly in arrears. The lease is a ten year lease.

Financial Review

This has been another successful year for the nursery with a high number of enrolments and a busy timetable throughout. The Trustees maintained a level of fees for the year that they believed would cover the estimated expenditure and achieve a small surplus to build up our reserves for future activities. The Trustees and management team closely monitored the budget throughout the year and were pleased to see fee income achieved at a similar level to the previous year.

The financial statements show a deficit of £6,022 (2012 £12,062 surplus) for the year and total reserves of £158,439 (2012 £164,461) These include restricted funds of £2,619 (2012 £6,187) that must be spent on specific training initiatives

Reserves Policy

Our reserves are made up of both restricted and unrestricted reserves. Our restricted funds must be spent in accordance with funders' criteria and within agreed timescales. This is carefully monitored and reported on regularly to funders.

We believe it is prudent to hold a level of unrestricted reserves that will support the charity during periods of uncertainty and any exceptional circumstances where additional financial support is needed

Any surplus achieved in the year will be added to these reserves. Included are designated reserves created specifically for redundancy and other contractual commitments in the event of closing down, a hardship fund (previously known as the bursary fund) to help parents with unexpected financial difficulties and a maintenance fund to enable any large-scale repairs or replacement equipment. A general reserve allows for any unexpected drop in income or cash flow problems during the year.

This year we spent a further £2,500 on staff initiatives using the EYPS funding. We also spent a proportion of the Anniversary Garden fund (created the previous year) on costs incurred during the summer holidays. An amount has been carried forward to cover the remaining costs of this project. Our maintenance reserve of £12,000 has not been used this year, however essential repairs have been identified for the toilet block within the building and these are likely to use up most of this designated reserve in 2013/14. We have used a small amount from our Hardship Fund and will continue to use this as and when the needs arise. We also have an amount remaining from fundraising activities and this has been earmarked for use in 2013/14 for children's play equipment within the Anniversary Garden. The use of all designated and restricted funds is agreed by the trustees at their regular quarterly meetings.

TRUSTEES' RESPONSIBILITIES STATEMENT

The Trustees (who are also directors of Millington Road Nursery School Trust for the purposes of company law) are responsible for preparing the Trustees' Report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice) Company law requires the Trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year. Under company law the Trustees must not approve the financial statements unless they are satisfied that they give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charitable company and of the incoming resources and application of resources, including the income and expenditure, of the charitable company for that period. In preparing these financial statements, the Trustees are required to

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently,
- observe the methods and principles in the Charities SORP,
- make judgments and accounting estimates that are reasonable and prudent,
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charitable company will continue in operation

The Trustees are responsible for keeping adequate accounting records that are sufficient to show and explain the charitable company's transactions and disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charitable company and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charitable company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

In preparing this report, the Trustees have taken advantage of the small companies exemptions provided by section 415A of the Companies Act 2006

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 AUGUST 2013

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1.1 BASIS OF PREPARATION OF FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, with the exception of investments which are included at market value, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008) The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP), 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities' published in March 2005, applicable accounting standards and the Companies Act 2006

1.2 CASH FLOW

The financial statements do not include a Cash Flow Statement because the Charity, as a small reporting entity, is exempt from the requirement to prepare such a statement under the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008)

1.3 TANGIBLE FIXED ASSETS AND DEPRECIATION

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost of fixed assets, less their estimated residual value, over their expected useful lives on the following bases.

14 COMPANY STATUS

The Charity is a company limited by guarantee. The members of the company are the Trustees named on page 2. In the event of the Charity being wound up, the liability in respect of the guarantee is limited to £1 per member of the Charity.

1.5 FUND ACCOUNTING

General funds are unrestricted funds which are available for use at the discretion of the Trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the Charity and which have not been designated for other purposes

Designated funds comprise unrestricted funds that have been set aside by the Trustees for particular purposes. The aim and use of each designated fund is set out in the notes to the financial statements.

Restricted funds are funds which are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions imposed by donors or which have been raised by the Charity for particular purposes. The costs of raising and administering such funds are charged against the specific fund. The aim and use of each restricted fund is set out in the notes to the financial statements.

Investment income, gains and losses are allocated to the appropriate fund

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

1.6 INCOMING RESOURCES

All incoming resources are included in the Statement of Financial Activities when the Charity has entitlement to the funds, certainty of receipt and the amount can be measured with sufficient reliability

Donated services or facilities, which comprise donated services, are included in income at a valuation which is an estimate of the financial cost borne by the donor where such a cost is quantifiable and measurable. No income is recognised where there is no financial cost borne by a third party.

Income tax recoverable in relation to donations received under Gift Aid or deeds of covenant is recognised at the time of the donation

Income tax recoverable in relation to investment income is recognised at the time the investment income is receivable

1.7 RESOURCES EXPENDED

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been included under expense categories that aggregate all costs for allocation to activities. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular activities they have been allocated on a basis consistent with the use of the resources.

Support costs are those costs incurred directly in support of expenditure on the objects of the Charity and include overheads incurred in the running of the Nursery Governance costs are those incurred in connection with administration of the Charity and compliance with constitutional and statutory requirements

18 PENSIONS

The Charity operates a defined contribution pension scheme and the pension charge represents the amounts payable by the Charity to the fund in respect of the year

1.9 VALUE ADDED TAX

The Charity is not registered for value added tax and consequently the irrecoverable VAT is included within the relevant costs in the Statement of Financial Activities
