REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2012

The Trustees present their report and independently examined accounts for the period shown above. The Trust is a Company Limited by Guarantee governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association and is also a Registered Charity under the Charities Act 1993.

Organisational Structure

The activities of the Trust are governed by the Trustees, all of whom are Directors, and is administered by a committee consisting of the Trustees and any senior member of the medical staff

Investment Powers

Any investments or land belonging to the Trust, other than monies required for ordinary expenditure of the Trust, shall be vested with such concense as may be necessary in the official Custodian for Charities. The Trust Deed authorises the Trustees to make and hold investments using the general funds of the Charity.

Constitution, Objects and Policies

The Trust is incorporated as a Limited Company by Guarantee from March 2005

The Charitable Trust is constituted by Trust Deed and its objects are to relieve sufferers of myocardial infarction and similar heart complaints or disease and providing rehabilitation unit facilities and after care in addition, the Trust also finance and carry out obesity courses on patients who are suffering from heart diseases

Development, Activities and Achievements

The Trust continues to be part funded by Walsall Primary Care Trust, whose contributions continue to be based on new patient referrals

The activity levels this year are very similar to 2010/11 The total referrals for this year were 796 compared with 792 last year. The highest proportion of referrals were by-pass and angioplasty and stent patients.

The annual report compared figures for referral against commencement and completion and the following have been noted
These will be monitored on an annual basis to see if there is a theme over the next few years

- More male patients commenced the programme from referral (71%) than women (56%)
- The patients completing is similar on gender and ethnicity (76%)
- There appears to be a poorer uptake of the course by patients falling within the 'any other' category
- It appears that the up take at commencement and completion increases with age. This makes sense, taking into consideration patients returning to work, but also indicates that there is a need to look at alternative programmes which address flexibility for the younger patients.
- There appears to be a lower up take in certain patient groups but, in the majority of these groups, the % increases for completion. In relation to MI (heart attack) patients, it was one of the areas investigated following last year's independent examination and it appeared that in the majority of cases the patients were in nursing homes and/or felt unable to undertake an exercise programme or attend another facility.

Referrals have been received from the local Hospital, New Cross (tertiary centre), GPs, and other hospitals in and outside the area. The majority of referrals were received from New Cross Hospital (68%)

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2012

The majority of patients were white British (86%) with 10% Asian patients and 4% other/unknown 523 patients commenced a cardiac rehabilitation programme (66%)

Heart Care has continued to provide a menu-driven service, with the professional staff ascertaining and agreeing the best pathway for each individual. Educational sessions have continued for specific groups of patients such as those waiting surgery, those suffering from angina, in additional to the general day programme being provided every 6 weeks and relaxation sessions. In addition the home programme has been further promoted and added a trial web based programme which will be evaluated throughout 2012/13.

The total number of patients who completed a relevant programme during the year is 392 (75%)

The Trustees continue to be committed to raising additional funds. The Fund-Raising and Publicity Officer organises various activities throughout the West Midlands, including Ladies' Evenings, Craft Evenings, Sponsored Walks, Wine Tasting evenings and sale of goods relating to the Trust, supported by patients, ex-patients and local industry

After care sessions continue with patients who have completed the free rehabilitation course making their own donations to the Charity each time they attend. These patients continue to be monitored by the Trust medical staff to retain their correct lifestyle and fitness.

Financial Review

The Trustees have negotiated a rolling contract which will continue to safeguard cardiac referrals on a year on year basis and excess numbers will be paid for in arrears

The Weight Management Programme continued in the year and has proved very successful providing additional help to heart patients and also new patients who are high risk for coronary heart disease referred to the Trust by the Primary Care Trust This contract will be reviewed on an annual basis

In addition, a rehabilitation service for patients suffering from COPD has been established and commissioned by the Primary Care Trust and it is hoped that this will continue over the next few years

Future Developments

The Trustees continue to develop a wider field of health care and prevention of heart disease. The weight management programmes are continuing to develop in conjunction with Walsall Primary Care Trust, together with new services looking at how our specialist programme can benefit other groups of patients

The Trustees have agreed that a trial providing counselling services to patients is undertaken which will be evaluated accordingly evaluated during 2012/13

The home programme combined with the web based service will also be evaluated during 2012/13

Close links continue with the National Health Smoking Cessation Programme, Physical Activity Team, Black Country Cardiovascular Network and the Community Cardiac Nursing Team

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS

1 Accounting Policies

1.1 Basis of preparation

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention and include the results of the charity's operations described in the Trustees Report, all of which are continuing

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice for charity accounts

The charity has taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No 1 from the requirements to produce a cashflow statement on the grounds that it qualifies as a small charity

1.2 Tangible fixed assets

Assets for use by the charity are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided on fixed assets on a reducing balance basis at the following rates

Motor Vehicles	25%
Freehold Property	2% Straight line
Medical Equipment	25%
Fixtures and Fittings	15%

1.3 Income

Voluntary income and donations are accounted for as received by the charity. The income from fundraising ventures is shown gross, with the associated costs included in expenditure. No permanent endowments have been received.

1.4 Taxation

- a) The trust is exempt from taxation
- b) Value Added Tax is not recoverable by the charity and is included in the relevant costs

1.5 Fundraising costs

Fundraising expenditure includes costs incurred in inducing financial contributions to the charity together with the costs of advertising for donations and the staging of special events
