NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2015

1 Accounting policies

1.1 Accounting convention

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention.

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis as in the directors' opinion the predicted future cash flows from the group's joint venture investments and funds available under the group loan facilities will be sufficient to meet the company's liabilities as they fall due.

The company has taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No 1 from the requirement to produce a cash flow statement on the grounds that it is a small company.

1.2 Compliance with accounting standards

The financial statements are prepared in accordance with applicable United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice), which have been applied consistently (except as otherwise stated).

1.3 Investments

The company meets the description of an investment fund given in FRS9, Associates and Joint Ventures, and its Joint Ventures are held as part of an investment portfolio. Accordingly, and as permitted by FRS9, these investments are included in the balance sheet at cost less any necessary impairment charges.

The company's loan balances with its joint ventures are capitalised as fixed asset loans to joint ventures.

In accordance with this policy, the company's share of the results of its joint ventures are not recognised until the underlying investments are realised, except to the extent that investment income is recognised as set out below.

1.4 Deferred taxation

Deferred taxation is provided in full in respect of taxation deferred by timing differences between the treatment of certain items for taxation and accounting purposes. The deferred tax balance has not been discounted.

1.5 Foreign currency translation

Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rates of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. Transactions in foreign currencies are recorded at the rate ruling at the date of the transaction. All differences are taken to profit and loss account.

1.6 Investment income

The company's share of the profits and losses of its joint venture investments in Limited Partnerships (LPs) and partnerships accrue to the company, and are therefore included in the profit and loss account, as they arise. This accrued income is regarded as an additional investment and is therefore included in the balance sheet as additional loans to the respective joint ventures.

15 Related party relationships and transactions

During the year repayment fees of £33,124 (2014: £3,333) were charged by Lumley Properties 1 LLP of which A J Pettit and W J Killick are designated members.

During the year directors' fees of £Nil (2014: £11,250) and arrangement fees of £Nil (2014: £9,378) were charged by Real Estate Venture Capital Management LLP, a fellow subsidiary undertaking of the ultimate controlling company.

The company has taken advantage of the exemption available in accordance with FRS 8 'Related party disclosures' not to disclose transactions entered into between two or more members of a group, as the company is a wholly owned subsidiary undertaking of the group to which it is party to the transactions.
