Report of the Trustees **for the Year Ended 30th September 2019**

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 30th September 2019. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

The objects of the Society, in the governing Memorandum, are:

- o to secure the preservation, protection, development and improvement of features of general public amenity or historic or public interest in the area of benefit or adjacent areas;
- o to educate the public in the geography, history, natural history and architecture of the area of benefit;
- o to preserve the character of the area of benefit as a thriving community;
- o to promote a high standard of planning and architecture in or affecting the area of benefit, and to oppose any inappropriate developments;
- o to represent the views of the members to local and other authorities;
- o to help foster community spirit by arranging lectures, social events and other appropriate activities.

The Trustees have had regard to the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit.

These objectives have been achieved largely through the work of the committees; Planning, Community Services, Local History, Meetings & Social and Walks and Natural Environment. Information on the Society's activities has been publicised through the Newsletter, the Website and social media.

Methods used to recruit and appoint new charity trustees

The Trustee Directors may at any time co-opt a member who is qualified to be appointed as an Ordinary Trustee Director to take office until the next AGM, upon which, if elected at the AGM may serve for a period of three years. A retiring Trustee Director who remains qualified may stand for re-election at an AGM. Officers of the Society (Chairman, Deputy Chairman, Honorary Secretary and Honorary Treasurer) are elected by the members at the AGM.

Community Services Committee

The Community Services Committee continues to maintain close contacts with Solihull M.B.C., the Police, Public Transport providers, and the Airport to ensure that the views of the Society are heard in all relevant areas. We have continued with the help of volunteers to tidy up the raised flower beds and undertake litter picking around the village.

We have also been actively involved together with local Councillors and Traders with the Council's recent decision to change their pricing structure for the use of the public car parks and continue to monitor the resultant impact to the local economy of the Village. It is intended this monitoring will continue coupled to consequent representations being made to the Council as necessary.

Local History Committee

We continue to maintain the archives of Knowle for which thanks go to our archivist Kathy Jephcott, who works quietly behind the scenes and keeps the archives up to date. We also man the local history centre every Saturday morning in order to answer visitors' queries.

We have presented several exhibitions based on the history of Knowle and of Knowle people. By far the most popular of the 2019 exhibitions has been 'Down Your Way' which explored the history and the meaning of Knowle street names.

1,600 Christmas cards depicting a scene from the village painted by Mike Humphries were printed this year and were sold out within less than 4 weeks. Profits of £608 from the sale will be donated to the new Chemotherapy & Oncology Day Unit at Solihull Hospital.

Planning Committee

This year saw the momentous decision of an approximate 97% majority of voters in March which ensured the Neighbourhood Plan became council policy. The problem now being encountered is the lack of experience with council planning officers of its status when considering individual applications, but as time passes, they are improving.

We have a Committee that is now looking at more and more applications which impact on Knowle and, I am pleased to report, occasionally our recommendations are successful but in turn, this can lead to an Appeal.

Win or lose, however, at least we can say 'we tried our best' and although sometimes our 'best' is not good enough, our relationship with individual officers, which I believe is very good, is maintained throughout our discussions on individual applications.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

My thanks on your behalf to the Committee members for another year's efforts.

Natural Environment Committee

Emphasis for most of the year has been on the Job's Close Local Nature Reserve (LNR), mainly relating to the pond and the establishment of a wildflower triangle. Indications are that funding for major works on the pond may become available shortly. A small fence has been erected to deter people from damaging the tender plants in the triangle. We have agreed with SMBC and the Jarman family that a tree will be planted in the LNR in memory of Stella Jarman, who, amongst other great conservation work, was the driving force behind achieving the designation of the area as a LNR. Bulb planting has continued with the help of the Scouting community. A photo-book has been created illustrating the previous years' planting. The Tesco Bags of Help project is now complete.

Library

It has been another busy year in the library which, with the help of 24 volunteers, has seen over 8,500 visitors since 2011. In partnership with the Libraries department of Solihull Council, a project was initiated to develop the courtyard of the local Library, the Grade II* listed Chester House, to create a community events space that celebrates the village conservation area and heritage. A feasibility study has been undertaken and a fundraising plan is being developed.

Meetings, Social & Walks

The Society continues to run a programme of local walks with the aims of promoting sharing experiences between Members and keeping the local footpaths open, while enhancing Members' knowledge of the area of benefit.

A well-supported programme of talks and walks occurred throughout the year. Our involvement with arrangements for the switching on the Christmas Lights in the High Street was again well supported and widely appreciated. A quiz to raise funds for the Knowle War Memorial project was also held.

Website and newsletter

In addition to its quarterly Members' Newsletter, the Society continues to make use of social media and direct emailing to keep Members up to date with Society events and other village activities.

Financial results for the Year

The year ending September 30th 2019 has been steady with an excess of income over expenditure of £3,274.

Financial aims for the forthcoming year

The 2018-19 accounting year began with £14,153 held in the general fund, with the remainder in restricted funds.

Membership

Membership on 30th September 2019 stood at 2,912; a reduction of 146 on the previous year, mostly arising from deaths or members moving away. Income from subscriptions was slightly down from last year reflecting the lower membership numbers.

Reserves Policy

The Reserves Policy of the Society is that sufficient funds are retained to cover a minimum of one year's normal expenditure. The end of year balance was comfortably above that level.

Governing document

The charity is governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association, and is a company limited by guarantee. The Company registration number is 05514023. As a Charity we are also governed by the provisions of the Charities Act 2016. Our Charity registration number is 1111085.

Risk management

The Trustees have a duty to identify and review the risks to which the charity is exposed and to ensure appropriate controls are in place to provide reasonable assurance against fraud and error. A review of the major risks has been carried out and no additional actions found necessary.

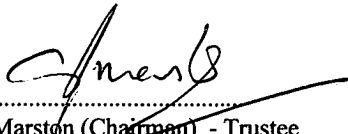

Independent examiner's report to the trustees of The Knowle Society ('the Company')

I report to the charity trustees on my examination of the accounts of the Company for the year ended 30th September 2019.

Responsibilities and basis of report

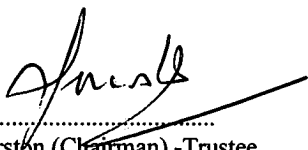
The members have not required the company to obtain an audit of its financial statements for the year ended 30th September 2019 in accordance with Section 476 of the Companies Act 2006.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.
