TRUSTEES' ANNUAL REPORT

YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2011

The trustees have pleasure in presenting their report and the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2011. The trustees have adopted the provisions of the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) "Accounting and Reporting by Charities (revised 2005)" in preparing the annual report and financial statements of the charity

GENERAL INFORMATION

The charity is a company limited by guarantee, incorporated on 4 February 2006, governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association It became registered as a charity on 6 April 2006

Trustees

The trustees during the year were John Arnott, Faustin Fernando, Nick Pengelly, Duncan Smith and Stuart Glassborow New trustees are appointed by the board of trustees in accordance with the articles of association

OBJECTIVES, ORGANISATION AND ACTIVITIES

The objectives of the charity as laid down in the Memorandum and Articles of Association are as follows

- a) to advance the Christian faith
- b) to relieve persons who are in conditions of need or hardship or who are aged or sick
- c) to advance education in accordance with Christian principles
- d) to promote and fulfil other charitable purposes beneficial to the community

Organisation

The trustees meet periodically, at least once a year, to oversee the work of the charity. The trustees have the power to invest the resources of the organisation in such assets as they see fit.

Related and Co-operating Charities

Catch The Fire Ministries, Toronto Airport Christian Fellowship, and Spread The Fire, all of which are NGOs based in Toronto, Canada, and Catch The Fire London, are co-operating charities of Catch The Fire Ministries (UK)

Public benefit

The charity trustees have complied with the duty in section 4 of the 2006 Charities Act to have due regard to the guidance on public benefit published by the Charity Commission in exercising their powers and duties

TRUSTEES' ANNUAL REPORT (CONTINUED)

YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2011

Reserves and Risk Management

It is the policy of the charity to maintain unrestricted funds, which are the free reserves of the charity, at a level which equates to approximately three months' unrestricted expenditure. This provides sufficient funds to cover management, administration and support costs.

The trustees have considered the key operational, financial, and strategic risks that have a bearing on the charity. Suitable management information is available to the trustees on a regular basis to monitor these risks, and allow any mitigating action to be taken to address them.

FINANCIAL REVIEW OF 2011

The SOFA can be viewed on page 6 which sets out the income and expenditure for the year

The charity's principal sources of income are donations received £154,896, Gift Aid claimed thereon £24,743, and conference fees £56,612 Total incoming resources for the year were £260,378, a 4% increase on the previous year

The main areas of expenditure were grants payable £56,424, staff salaries £43,996, ministry fees and honoraria £30,560 and missions work £30,346 Total expenditure for the year was £267,228, a 44% increase on the previous year

HIGHLIGHTS OF ACTIVITIES IN 2011

The charity has continued to actively pursue the objectives set out in the Memorandum and Articles of Association. In 2011 the charity has continued to experience growth in all areas but for the directors, more importantly, the previous year has been a year of true consolidation, which has been very satisfying to be a part of

We ran numerous equipping and training events in the UK and continued our partnership with Restoring the Foundations holding healing retreats as well as working closely with local churches across the UK. The directors were part of taking the values of CTF UK to over 38 different churches and organisations. We trialled new formats for the teaching weekends, and had a successful start in Jersey for four weekends in a year. We also partnered with Jesus Culture to run a value driven concert for 3,500.

We helped with the running of week-long leaders' schools in the UK and abroad, including Sheffield, Winchester, Kenya and encouragingly in Turkey to many Iranian and Turkish leaders. The charity started working with students and held an event at Loughborough University, Westminster University, York University and Portsmouth. At Westminster we helped run the CU Freshers Fair, resourcing supplies and helping with manpower. This work was resourced by paying Dan Davison for one day a week.

Chloe Glassborow continued as the National Coordinator for Catch the Fire Ministries UK based in the London office. This role included day-to-day oversight of all Catch the Fire Activities including the administration office that continued to be based in Wembley. This was run by Kimiko King with the assistance of other part-time staff and volunteers.

Regional volunteers have continued to help to connect with the supporters of Catch the Fire in their regions, as well as to help organise regional events to help to further the charty's objectives. We have also consolidated the donor base by employing Sarah Strong for 4 days a week to produce newsletters, run mission trips (such as 39 people going to Kenya for medical programmes, feeding programmes and outreach) and call them.

Money has continued to be raised towards funding International Leaders' Schools (ILSOM's) in various third world countries as well as supporting humanitarian needs in countries like Niger, Albania, the Philippines, Kenya, India, Iceland and South Africa.

CLOSE COMPANY PROVISIONS

In the opinion of the trustees, the charity is a close company within the meaning of \$434 income and Corporation Taxes Act 1988 (as amended).

STATEMENT OF TRUSTEES' RESPONSIBILITIES

Charity law requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year, which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity and of its financial activities for that year. In preparing those financial statements the trustees are required to:

- a) select suitable accounting policies and apply them consistently;
- b) make judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- c) state whether the policies adopted are in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice, "Accounting and Reporting by Charities (revised 2005)" and with applicable accounting standards, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements;
- d) prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to assume the charity will continue operating

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud or other irregularities.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP), "Accounting and Reporting by Charities (revised 2005)", the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (FRSSE), effective April 2008, and the 2006 Companies Act

Company status

The charity is a company limited by guarantee, which was incorporated on 4 February 2006. The members of the company are the trustees named on page 1. In the event of the charity being wound up, the liability in respect of the guarantee is limited to £10 per member of the charity.

Fund accounting

General funds are unrestricted funds which are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity and which have not been designated for other purposes

Designated funds comprise unrestricted funds that have been set aside by the trustees for particular purposes. Restricted funds are funds which are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions imposed by donors or which have been raised by the charity for particular purposes. The cost of raising and administering such funds are charged against the specific fund investment income and gains are allocated to the appropriate fund.

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. No amounts are included in the financial statements for services donated by volunteers.

Resources expended

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to the category

Fund-raising costs are those incurred in seeking voluntary contributions and do not include the costs of disseminating information in support of the charitable activities. Governance costs are those incurred in connection with administration of the charity and compliance with constitutional and statutory requirements.

Tangible fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Assets are capitalised if they have a useful life of more than one year and a cost value greater than £100.

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off the value of each asset over its expected useful life
