



Independent auditor's report to the members of Seabridge Freight Services (St. Helens) Limited

Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of Seabridge Freight Services (St. Helens) Limited which comprise the Income statement, the Statement of financial position for the financial year ended 31 December 2019, and the related notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies.

The financial reporting framework that has been applied in the preparation is applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards, including Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice).


Responsibilities of the auditor for the audit of the financial statements (continued)



Notes to the financial statements

For the year ended 31 December 2019

1. General information

Seabridge Freight Services (St Helens) Limited (the Company) is a private company limited by shares. The Company is incorporated in the United Kingdom with a registered office of 5-7 Grosvenor Court, Foregate Street, Chester, England.

1.1 Basis of preparation of financial statements

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards, including Section 1A of Financial Reporting Standard 102 – 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland' (FRS 102), and with the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis unless otherwise specified within these accounting policies.

The preparation of financial statements in compliance with FRS 102 requires the use of certain critical accounting estimates. It also requires management to exercise judgment in applying the Company's accounting policies (see note 3).

The financial statements are presented in GBP (£).

The following principal accounting policies have been applied:

1.2 Financial instruments

The Company only enters into basic financial instrument transactions that result in the recognition of financial assets and liabilities like trade and other debtors and creditors, loans from banks and other third parties, loans to related parties and investments in ordinary shares.
