NOTES TO THE CONSOLIDATED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

For the year ended 31 March 2008

1 Accounting policies

1.1 Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost covention, adopting the following principal accounting policies all of which are in accordance with applicable Accounting Standards.

1.2 Going concern

The group's balance sheet at 31 March 2008 indicates that its liabilities exceeded its assets. Furthermore because of a breach of banking covenants the bank loans that were negotiated as a term loan facility technically became repayable on demand. In accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 25 this loan has therefore been disclosed as an amount repayable within one year. The group is currently negotiating revised terms with the bank and the directors do not foresee any reason why repayment will be required before the originally agreed dates. In addition, no action has been taken by the bank to demand immediate repayment. Furthermore the group has received assurance from the ultimate controlling shareholder that it will advance further funds to meet any third party obligations should this be necessary.

Management information produced shows that the group has improved on its performance achieved in the year ended 31 March 2008. The group's forecasts, taking into account reasonably possible changes in trading performance, show that the group should be able to operate within the facilities originally agreed with the bank and service payments of interest and capital in accordance with the terms of all debt outstanding.

After making enquiries, the directors have a reasonable expectation that the group has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Accordingly, they continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the financial statements.

1.3 Basis of consolidation

The consolidated financial statements comprise the financial statements of Cascade Care Group Limited and its subsidiaries made up to 31 March 2008.

1.4 Turnover

Turnover represents the amounts receivable during the period for the provision of care and accommodation. Where the amount received relates to a period which covers the balance sheets date, that amount is apportioned over the period to which it relates.

1.5 Goodwill

Purchased goodwill is capitalised and is being written off over a period of 10 years. This period is considered by the directors to be its useful economic life.

1.6 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets other than freehold land are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows:

Freehold buildings

2% on cost

Fixtures, fittings & equipment

33% on cost

Motor vehicles

20% reducing balance

Freehold land is not depreciated.

1.7 Leasing and hire purchase commitments

Assets obtained under hire purchase contracts and finance leases are capitalised as tangible assets and depreciated over the shorter of the lease term and their useful lives. Obligations under such agreements are included in creditors net of the finance charge allocated to future periods. The finance element of the rental payment is charged to the profit and loss account so as to produce a constant periodic rate of charge on the net obligation outstanding in each period.

Rentals payable under operating leases are charged against income on a straight line basis over the lease term.

1.8 Investments

Fixed asset investments are stated at cost less provision for diminution in value.

1.9 Deferred taxation

Deferred taxation is provided in full in respect of taxation deferred by timing differences between the treatment of certain items for taxation and accounting purposes. The deferred tax balance has not been discounted.

1.10 Cash flow statement

The company has taken advantage of the exemption offered by Financial Reporting Standard 1, Cash Flow Statements, and has not prepared a cash flow statement.

2 Turnover

The total turnover of the group for the year has been derived from its principal activity wholly undertaken in the United Kingdom.

The bank loans, overdraft and other loan stock are secured by a first debenture incorporating fixed and floating charges over the assets and undertakings of each company in the group.

The bank loans and other loan stock are also secured on legal mortgages over freehold properties included within tangible fixed assets.

The charges are subject to an inter-creditor deed, which specifies that if any resolution is passed or order made for the winding-up, liquidation, dissolution, administration of reorganisation, except a solvent reorganisation on terms previously approved by the holders of the other loan stock, of the company or any analogous event occurs anywhere, then the other loan stock shall be subordinate in right of payment to the bank loans.
