1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparation

The Directors of the Company have taken the decision to prepare the current and future years Financial Statements in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards ("IFRS") issued by the International Accounting Standards Board ("IASB") as adopted by the European Union ("EU").

The preparation of Financial Statements in conformity with IFRS issued by the IASB as adopted by the EU requires the use of certain critical accounting estimates. It also requires management to exercise its judgement in the process of applying the Company's accounting policies. Where any such judgements are made they are indicated within the accounting policies. There are no significant estimates in the Financial Statements as at 31 March 2020.

The accounting policies have been consistently applied to all the years presented, unless otherwise stated.

The financial information in these Financial Statements has been prepared on the basis of standards applicable as at 31 March 2020.

Changes in accounting policy and disclosures

(a) New and amended standards and interpretations adopted by the Company

A number of new standards were effective from 1 April 2019 but they had no impact on the Company's Financial Statements

(b) Early adoption of standards

The Company did not early adopt any new or amended standards in the year ended 31 March 2020.

Functional and presentation currency

Items included in the Financial Statements are measured using the currency of the primary economic environment in which the Company operates ("the functional currency"). The Financial Statements are presented in pound sterling, which is the Company's functional and presentation currency.

Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents are defined as cash in hand, demand deposits, and highly liquid investments readily convertible within three months or less to known amounts of cash and subject to insignificant risk of changes in value.

Share capital

Shares are classified as equity when there is no obligation to transfer cash or other assets. Incremental costs directly attributable to the issue of new shares are shown in equity as a deduction, net of tax, from the proceeds.
