Structure, Governance and Management

The organisation is a charitable company limited by guarantee incorporated on 19th April 2006 and registered as a charity on 8th March 2007. The company was established under a Memorandum of Association which established the objects and powers of the charitable company and is governed by its Articles of Association. In the event of the company being wound up members are required to contribute an amount not exceeding £1 each.

The directors of the company are also charity trustees for the purposes of charity law. Under the requirements of the Memorandum and Articles of Association the trustees are re-elected annually at the Annual General Meeting.

Objectives and Activities

These are the preservation and protection of the good mental and physical health of families and individuals through the provision of support and counselling services in accordance with Christian principles.

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Public Benefit

The trustees have a statutory duty under the Charities Act 2006 (s 4(6) c50) to have regard to the guidance issued from time to time by the Charity Commission. This includes the requirement to demonstrate that the charity's work represents a benefit to the public.

The trustees believe that this report taken as a whole provides evidence of the public benefit of the charity's work in 2010/11

The principal public benefits of the Company include -

- the provision of support and counselling to families and individuals

Achievements and Performance

During the year our counsellors provided 628 counselling sessions and we received 94 enquiries which resulted in 25 cases

Financial Review

Details of the company's finances are shown in the Financial Accounts A deficit of £21,434 was incurred on the General account, leaving balances of £76,604 on unrestricted funds which represents just under two years normal expenditure. The balance on endowment funds amounts to £178,771

The accounts are in a healthy position at the present time.

It is our policy to keep in reserve at least a sum required to meet the annual expenditure of the Company

With regard to Investments, it is our policy to keep the bulk of them with COIF and take the advice of the Finance Committee of the Diocese of Chelmsford with regard to any movement of funds.

FAMILY CARE COUNSELLING SERVICE - CHAIRMAN'S REPORT 2010-11

The biggest change to report for the year is that in the early autumn, Anne Wright left Family Care to concentrate on Counselling work with young people. Anne was replaced as Manager by Alex Daziel who came to us with proven counselling and administration skills. Within a couple of months he had set up an informative website, presented the trustees with a Business Plan and re-vamped our publicity. The Trustees welcome him warmly and look forward to working with him as the Plan is implemented and no doubt refined.

Everyone at Family Care is dedicated to providing an affordable and professional Counselling Service for those who come to us with a variety of needs. This would not, of course, be possible without a dedicated and highly qualified group of Counsellors. The Trustees are pleased that, during this year, we have strengthened our links with those who are at the focus point of our work. We have welcomed at our meetings a Counsellor representative, chosen by the Counsellors not simply to represent them but also, importantly, to help the Trustees to understand more fully the complexities of counselling. The professional advice and insight this brings to our work is of immense value. An essential part of the work of Trustees is to support and help the Service to develop. I am pleased that we have been able to do this during the year. I am conscious, however, that the body of Trustees needs strengthening and it must become a priority in the year ahead to seek and appoint new Trustees to join us in our work. I would be grateful for any suggestions of such suitable people whom we might approach.

One of our Trustees, Martin Charlesworth, has acted as our Treasurer for many years. He steered us through the complexities of becoming a limited company and in our move to Waltham Abbey. Martin has been an invaluable, loyal and dedicated friend to the FC Service. At our Annual meeting he will be relinquishing this post though he will remain a Trustee. As yet we have not found anyone to replace him as Treasurer.

I wish to put on record my thanks to Martin and to all our Trustees who have met and deliberated and served with unstinting generosity. I also thank our Counsellors and all who support them in their work, especially our receptionists and, of course, Vivien who is a great treasure! She steered the office through the transitional period from Anne to Alex and is a constant on whom we can rely.

Waltham Abbey Church and PCC have been supportive of our work, for which we are very grateful. The Church is not only our Landlord but also is our praying friend and a tangible reminder that our roots as a Care Service are in the local Christian Communities of Epping Forest Area. During the year, the new Rector, the Revd. Peter Smith, took up office and we are already grateful to him for his interest in us and his care for our well being.

Family Care owes a great deal to the dedicated work of Anne Wright who, building on the foundations of her predecessor, led us to new experiences of sharing our care with the vulnerable and needy in our society. We wish her well in her new work which is her vocation.

We look forward to our future with Alex at the helm. Already he has made his mark and we are grateful for his expertise. The Trustees are happy to share his vision and to work to make it come true.

After the upheaval of the move to Waltham Abbey we believe we are now firmly established in our new home. Alex's report gives us a professional picture of where we are at. I pray that God will guide us all into an exciting and fulfilling future.

Notes forming part of the Financial Statements for the year ended 31 March 2011

1. Accounting Policies

The principal accounting policies are summarised below. The accounting policies have been applied consistently throughout the year and in the preceding year.

(a) Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, as modified by the inclusion of fixed asset investments at market value, and in accordance with the Companies Act 1985 and the Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting and Reporting by Charities issued in March 2005.

(b) Fund accounting

- Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity.
- Restricted funds are subjected to restrictions on their expenditure imposed by the donor or through the terms of an appeal.

(c) Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when the charity is entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income:

- Voluntary income is received by way of grants, donations and gifts and is included in full
 in the Statement of Financial Activities when receivable. Grants, where entitlement is not
 conditional on the delivery of a specific performance by the charity, are recognised when
 the charity becomes unconditionally entitled to the grant.
- Donated services and facilities are included at the value to the charity where this can be quantified. The value of services provided by volunteers has not been included in these accounts.
- Investment income is included when receivable.
- Incoming resources from grants, where related to performance and specific deliverables, are accounted for as the charity earns the right to consideration by its performance.

(d) Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accrual basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure includes VAT which is not recoverable, and is reported as part of the expenditure to which it relates:

- Chantable expenditure compnses those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries.
- Governance costs include those costs associated with meeting the constitutional and statutory requirements of the charity and include costs linked to the strategic management of the charity.
- All costs are allocated between the expenditure categories of the SoFA on a basis designed to reflect the use of the resource. Costs relating to a particular activity are allocated directly, others are apportioned on an appropriate basis.

(e) Fixed assets

Investments held as fixed assets are revalued at mid-market value at the balance sheet date and the gain or loss taken to the Statement of Financial Activities

The trustees have agreed to the wishes of the donor of funds representing the Pamela Lewis Fund to show the total relocation costs as a charge in the current years and not to capitalise the sum relating to the leasehold improvements.

The Endowment funds are to be invested on behalf of the Company by the Diocese of Chelmsford for the direct purpose of providing counselling in a safe environment, with the income from them to be used for the general activities of the Company.

The Pamela Lewis Fund is the proceeds of a legacy from the estate of the late Miss Pamela Lewis who was a much respected former trustee of the counselling service, after whom the premises at Waltham Abbey have been named.

11. Future Obligations

In the current year £3,168 was paid in respect of rent in accordance with the Lease of 5a Greenyard and the amount to be paid in the next financial year is £3,350. The term of the lease is ten years from December 2007.
