During the year December 2010 - November 2011, Blues and Beer CIC has Organised and run the annual Wallingford Blues and Beer Festival. This year the festival attracted around 1,000 paying attendees who enjoyed 10 musical acts, predominantly playing the Blues. Whilst enjoying the music they also were able to sample 21, predominantly local, traditional draught beers, local cider from Upton and local wine from Brightwell. The organisation of the festival started in October 2010, the festival was held on the 10th and 11th June 2011 and donations, totalling £2,500 were made to our two chosen charities in September

The Stakeholders can be broadly split into three groups

1 Festival Attendees

One aim of Blues and Beer CIC is to 'Provide Live Blues Music' to the local people. Although not exclusive to locals the vast majority of the 1,000 attendees travel from within a 20 mile radius. The reaction of those stakeholders is obvious and immediate, this is considered for the next festival.

A second aim is to 'Provide a selection of, predominantly local, traditional draught beers, some 3,500 pints were consumed over the two days

2 Regular Helpers

The festival is run by a combination of the committee, or board of directors, helpers from our chosen charities and a group of helpers whose only benefit is to see a successful festival in 'their' town. These often play key roles as they help regularly, know how the festival is run and provide frequent feedback.

3 Charities

The two chosen charities are engaged early in the process, in January immediately after the choice is made by the committee. Members of the charities are involved with the organisation, including publicity and staff planning. At the actual festival, members of the charities help with a variety of activities but primarily staff the bars and barbeque. The charities then received a donation of £1,250 each.
