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#### TRUSTEES REPORT

#### YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2018

The trustees present their report and the unaudited financial statements of the charity for the year ended 30 June 2018.

#### OBJECTS OF THE CHARITY, PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES AND ORGANISATION OF WORK

The company is governed by a memorandum and articles of association. The principal object of the company is the relief of those in need, by reason of youth, age, ill-health, disability, financial hardship or other disadvantage including unemployment, primarily in Cardiff and the surrounding areas, for the public benefit.

During the year, the charity has agreed that the current aims of the charity are, as follows:

- 1. To support children and young people that live in the more disadvantaged environments of Cardiff in a way that builds their confidence and created an enjoyment of learning, which, as a consequence, will increase the likelihood of a higher attainment level with school examinations and better life opportunities.
- 2. To increase the confidence of speakers of other languages to communicate effectively in their new environment

The charity is organised so that the Board meet regularly to manage its affairs. All staff are engaged in charitable activities.

### REVIEW OF DEVELOPMENTS, ACTIVITIES AND ACHIEVEMENTS

During the year, the charity's founder, and leader through the first twelve years of its existence, Gerald Puttock, left his role of COO. Gerry has often been called "Mr ACE" by those who have interacted with him. Gerry has accepted the Trustees invitation to become a patron of the charity, alongside Dame Shirley Bassey. We wish Gerry well in his new adventures and endeavour to carry on the legacy that he created.

The trustees recruited a local individual, with relevant experience in community education and youth work, to build on our relationship with the target communities. We consider that the charity has maintained the level and quality of current core activities, focusing its after-school learning support, for children of primary and secondary school age living in the less advantaged areas of Cardiff.

The mixed and single-sex ESOL (English for speakers of other languages) classes in the Butetown and Ely areas of Cardiff, primarily for refugees and asylum seekers, have expanded through our partnership with Adult Learning Wales. These have been very successful, assisting their process of settling in Wales and becoming economically self-sufficient.

#### **FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS**

The trustees continue to review the company's activities, together with other opportunities that fit with its objects, and will provide a level of support consistent with its ability to attract future funding. It is anticipated that both the after-school learning support and the ESOL classes will gradually expand around our core activities and geographies.

#### **RISKS POLICY**

The trustees actively review the major risks that the charity faces on a regular basis and believe that ongoing reviews of the financial position, establishing adequate reserves, will provide sufficient resources in the event of adverse conditions. The trustees also examine other operational risks faced by the charity and have established systems to mitigate any significant risks.

#### RESULTS

The results for the year and the charity's financial position at the end of the year are shown in the attached financial statements.

The charity is extremely grateful for repeat funding from a variety of charitable foundations. Long term funding for the core activities of the charity continues to be challenging and we are exploring various opportunities to improve this area. The charity utilised opening unrestricted reserves to create a stronger base for its two main activities and expects that a number of partnerships that are being established will strengthen future funding applications.

# NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2018

#### 1. Accounting policies

**Basis of accounting** – The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with FRS 102, The Financial Reporting Standards applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (as applied to small entities by section 1A of the standard).

Cash flow statement – The directors have taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No. 1 from including a cash flow statement on the grounds that the company is small.

*Incoming resources* – All incoming resources are recognised when receivable and when all conditions for receipt have been met. No expenditure has been netted off incoming resources in the Statement of Financial Activities.

**Resources expended** – costs of activities in furtherance of the charity's objects represent those costs incurred directly in connection with charitable activities. Management and administration costs comprise costs associated with managing and administering the charity and include an appropriate apportionment of overheads.

Funds structure – Unrestricted funds are those available for general use by the charity. Designated funds are unrestricted funds which have been set aside by the Trustees for specific purposes. Restricted funds are those where the donor has imposed restrictions on their use.
