The Company relies upon the support of its parent company, Northgate plc, and the going concern status of the Company is dependent upon the ongoing support of its parent. The parent company has confirmed that it is the current intention to provide sufficient financial support to enable the Company to meet its liabilities as they fall due for a period of not less than 12 months from the date of approval of the financial statements. The directors have considered this letter of intent, have made enquiries of group management and have concluded that the Company is a going concern. The directors have considered this uncertainty and the intention of the parent to continue to support the Company and after making these enquiries, the directors have a reasonable expectation that the company has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. # NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS Year ended 30 April 2010

### 1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statements are prepared in accordance with applicable United Kingdom accounting standards

The principal accounting policies are summarised below. They have been applied consistently throughout the current and preceding year

### Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention

#### Going concern

The current economic conditions create uncertainty particularly over the level of demand for the Group's rental vehicles and for the disposal of vehicles and the directors have reviewed the company's forecasts and projections taking account of reasonably possible downside sensitivities. #### Impairment

At the balance sheet date, the Company reviews the carrying amounts of its assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have suffered an impairment loss. If any such indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset is estimated to determine the extent of the impairment loss (if any)

An impairment loss is recognised in the profit and loss account whenever the carrying amount of an asset exceeds its recoverable amount

### Cash flow statement

The Company is exempt from the requirements of FRS 1 (revised) to include a cash flow statement as part of its financial statements as it is a wholly owned subsidiary of a group preparing consolidated financial statements, which include a consolidated cash flow statement

### Taxation

Current tax is charged or credited to profit and loss, except when it relates to items charged or credited directly to equity, in which case the current tax is also dealt with in equity

The charge/credit for current tax is based on the taxable result for the period. The taxable result for the period may differ from the result as reported in profit or loss because it excludes items which are non-assessable or disallowed and it further excludes items that are taxable or deductible in other periods. It is calculated using tax rates that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date.

### Dividend

Dividends on Ordinary shares are recognised as a liability in the period in which they are either paid or formally approved, whichever the earlier

### 6 AMOUNTS RECEIVABLE FROM GROUP COMPANIES

Amounts receivable from Group companies comprises a £440,489,809 (2009 - £437,248,299) Sterling denominated, interest bearing unsecured loan to a fellow Northgate plc subsidiary undertaking, which was entered into on 30 April 2007, and £609,347 (2009 - £643,876) due from the immediate parent company. The interest bearing loan bears interest at 3 25% above LIBOR and is redeemable in April 2012.

### 7 CREDITORS AMOUNTS FALLING DUE AFTER MORE THAN ONE YEAR

These comprise £412,945,272 (2009 – £412,945,272) of Sterling denominated loan notes from a fellow Northgate plc subsidiary undertaking. The loan notes are redeemable on 30 April 2012 and bear interest at 3 25% above LIBOR.
