Directors' report Year ended 31 August 2019

The directors present their report with the financial statements of the company for the year to 31 August 2019.

### **Principal activity**

The company is a wholly owned subsidiary of Harris Federation, a Company Limited by guarantee (Company registration No 6228587 in England and Wales).

The principal activity of the company is the construction work for a number of Harris Federation's academy buildings. In the year under review, the company did not undertake work on any of the Harris sites, however is remaining active for possible savings in the future.

### **Review of business**

The company began trading on 27 May 2007 and prior to that it was dormant. A summary of the results of the year's trading is given on page 7 of the financial statements.

### **Future developments**

The directors do not anticipate any significant change to the company's activities during the coming year.

### **Charitable donations**

Pincipal accounting policies. Year to 31 August 2010

The principal accounting policies adopted, judgements and key sources of estimation uncertainty in the preparation of the financial statements are laid out below.

### Basis of accounting

These financial statements have been prepared in compliance with applicable United Kingdom Accounting Standards, including Financial Reporting Standard 102 (FRS 102) Section 1A, the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland, and the Companies Act 2008.

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention with items recognised at cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant accounting policies below or the notes to these financial statements.

The financial statements are prepared in sterling and rounded to the nearest pound.

### Critical accounting estimates

Preparation of the financial statements requires the trustees to make significant judgements and estimates. The trustees do not consider that there are any sources of estimation uncertainty or any key judgements made in the preparation of the financial statements.

There are no key assumptions or areas of uncertainty where there is a significant risk of a material adjustment to the carrying value of the assets and liabilities of the company being required during the financial year ending 31 August 2019.

### Assessment of going concern

The directors have assessed whether the use of the going concern assumption is appropriate in preparing these financial statements. The directors have made this assessment in respect to a period of one year from the date of approval of these financial statements.

ine directors have concluded that there are no material uncertainties related to events or conditions that may cast significant doubtion the ability of the company to continue as a going concern. The directors are of the opinion that the company will have sufficient asources to meet the liabilities as they fall due.

#### Turnover

Turnover derives from the one principal activity of the company arising in the UK. Revenue is recognised at cost value when these services are provided, the amount of revenue can be measured reliably and it is probable that the economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the company. Where income is received in advance of this provision of services, it is held on the statement of financial position as deferred income and released in the period in which services are provided.

### Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the company to make a payment to a third party, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and excludes recoverable VAT. Expenditure comprises the direct costs associated with the delivery of the company's services as well as general administrative support costs.

#### Statement of cash flows

The financial statements do not include a statement of cash flows because the company, as a small reporting entity, is exempt from the requirement to prepare such a statement under section 1A of FRS102.

### **Debtors**

Debtors are recognised at their settlement amount, less any provision for nonrecoverability. They have been discounted to the present value of future cash receipts where such discounting is material.

### Cash at bank and in hand

Cash at bank and in hand represents such accounts and instruments that are available on demand or have a maturity of less than three months from the date of acquisition.

### Creditors

Creditors are recognised when there is an obligation at the balance sheet date as a result if a past event, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefit will be required in settlement, and the amount of the settlement can be measured reliably. Creditors are recognised at the amount the company anticipates it will pay to settle the debt. They have been discounted to the present value of the future cash payment where such discounting is material.

### Related party transactions

The company is a wholly-owned subsidiary of Harris Federation and has taken advantage of the exemption included within section 33 of FRS 102 not to disclose transactions with entities that are part of the group qualifying as related parties. Hence, transactions with Harris Federation are not separately disclosed. The consolidated financial statements in which the company is included are publicly available.

### 5 Control and related parties

Harris Federation, a Company Limited by guarantee (Company Registration Number 6228587 in England and Wales), is the ultimate parent undertaking of Harris Academies Project Management Limited. By virtue of this control Harris Federation is a related party for the purposes of FRS 102.

The financial statements do not include disclosure of transactions between the company and Harris Federation. This is because, as a subsidiary which is 100% controlled within the group, it is exempt from the requirement to disclose such transactions under section 33 of FRS 102.
