7 Related party disclosures

The company has taken advantage of the exemption conferred by Financial Reporting Standard 8 'Related party disclosures' not to disclose transactions with members of the group headed by BHFS One Limited, and Active Learning Childcare (Guernsey) Limited prior to 15 July 2015, on the grounds that 100% of the voting rights in the company are controlled within that group and the company is included in consolidated financial statements.

In the prior year, amounts owed to parent undertakings comprise of £873 owed to Active Learning Childcare (Guernsey) Limited.

8 Ultimate parent company and parent undertaking of larger group

The company's immediate parent undertaking is Active Learning (Guernsey) Limited, a company incorporated in Guernsey. The company's ultimate controlling party is Bright Horizons Family Solutions Inc which is the ultimate parent company incorporated in the United States of America. Prior to 15 July 2015, Active Learning Childcare (Guernsey) Limited was the parent undertaking, and the directors did not consider there to be an ultimate controlling party.

From 15 July 2015, the largest group in which the results of the company are consolidated is that headed by Bright Horizons Family Solutions Inc, incorporated in the United States of America. The smallest group in which they are consolidated is that headed by BHFS One Limited, incorporated in England and Wales.
