Review of Activities

This year was the twelfth in the existence of the company and the activities have proceeded in line with the policies of making the hall an important facility for the local community without being a draw on public funds.

The provision of facilities in support of the parish church has continued, with the use of the hall for Church fund raising events.

The scheme for showing films in rural communities which started in 2009 still continues being successful in bringing members of the community together at such events.

The hall is the venue for coffee after the Sunday morning services and also hosts the Church committee meetings.

Despite the uncertain financial and economic times the company continues to support and be supported by users and fundraisers in serving the local community.

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS YEAR ENDED 31ST DECEMBER 2018

1. Basis of preparation

1.1 Basis of accounting

These accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention with items recognised at cost or transactin value unless otherwise stated in the relevant note(s) to these accounts.

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with:

the Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting and Reporting by Charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) issued on 16 July 2014, and with

the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102), and with

the Charities Act 2011.

The charity constitues as a public benefit entity as defined by FRS 102.

2. Accounting Policies

The principal accounting policies adopted, judgements and key sources of estimation uncertainty in the preparation of the Financial Statements are as follows:

2.1 Income

Income is recognised when the charity becomes entitled to the funds, it is more likely than not that the trustees will receive the funds and the monetary value can be measured with sufficient reliability.

Offsetting

There has been no offsetting of assets and liabilities, or income and expenses, unless required or permitted by the FRS 102 SORP or FRS 102.

Grants and donations

Grants and donations are only included in the SOFA when the general income recognition criteria are met (5.10 to 5.12 FRS 102 SORP).

In the case of performance related grants, income is only recognised to the extent that the charity has provided the specified goods or services as entitlement to the grant only occurs when the performance related conditions are met (5.16 FRS 102 SORP)

Government grants

The charity has received government grants in the reporting period.

Contractual income and performance related grants

Contractual income and performance related grants are only included in the SoFA once the charity has provided the related goods or services or met the performance related conditions.

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS (continued) YEAR ENDED 31ST DECEMBER 2018

Accounting Policies (continued)

Volunteer help

The value of any voluntary help recieveed is not included in the accounts but is described in the trustees' annual report.

2.2 Expenditure and liabilities

Liabilities are recognised where it is more likely then not that there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to pay out resources and the amount of the obligation can be measured with reasonable certainty.

Governance and support costs

Support costs have been allocated between governance costs and other support. Governance costs comprise all costs involving public accountability of the charity and its compliance with regulation and good practice.

Grants payable

Where there are no conditions attaching to the grant that enables the donor charity to realistically avoid the commitment, a liability for the full funding obligation is recognised.

Creditors

The charity has creditors which are measured at settlement amounts less any trade discounts.

Provisions for liabilities

A liability is measured on recdognition at its historical cost and then subsequently measured at the best estimate of the amount required to settle the obligation at the reporting date.

2.3 Assets

Tangible fixed assets

These are capitalised if they can be used for more than one year. They are valued at cost and the depreciation rates and methods used are as follows:

Premises refurbishment

3.5% on cost

Equipment

25% on cost

Debtors

Debtors (including trade debtors and loans receivable) are measured on initial recognition at settlement amount after any trade discounts or amount advanced by the charity. Subsequently, they are measured at the cash or other consideration expected to be received.
