The directors are pleased to present their report together with the audited financial statements for the year ended 31 August 2013

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out on page 13 of the attached financial statements and comply with the charitable company's Memorandum and Articles of Association, applicable laws and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice on "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" issued in March 2005

Objectives and principal activities

ARK UK Programmes is a company limited by guarantee (Company No 05932797) and a UK registered charity (Charity No 1137932) ARK UK Programmes administers ARK's work in education in support of the Academies Programme, which focuses on transformational change to inner city schools in the UK

Organisation

ARK UK Programmes is a fully owned subsidiary of Absolute Return for Kids (ARK) (charity registration number 109532, company registration number 04589451), a charity established to improve the life chances of children, which runs projects around the world

The board of directors, which can have up to ten members, administers the company

On 1 September 2012, the Teaching Leaders programme was transferred out of ARK UK Programmes, becoming a separate legal entity, Teaching Leaders (company registration number 07984030, charity registration number 1146924) The relevant fund balance of £1 069m, representing the accumulated reserves of the programme, is shown as a transfer out in this year's balance sheet (see note 5)

Directors

The directors are also trustees of ARK UK Programmes for the purposes of charity law

All directors served for the full year None had any beneficial interest in the organisation or received any remuneration during the period, other than Lucy Heller who received remuneration in her role as Managing Director of ARK UK Programmes (see note 14)

Directors (continued)

On agreeing to become a director of the charitable company, the directors are briefed by their co-directors on the history of the charitable company, day-to-day management, the responsibilities of directors, current objectives and future plans. The directors are also encouraged to attend any courses relevant to their role, and to keep up to date with changes in legislation.

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Risk management

The directors have reviewed and assessed the major risks to which the charity is exposed. The directors believe they have established effective systems and procedures to mitigate those risks.

Achievements, performance and future plans

ARK UK Programmes acts as a 'seed-bed' for creating and testing new ARK programmes Two strands of programmes were delivered in 2012/13

- 1 Network Programmes (enrichment, music and university/careers success) which raise funds and deliver programmes across the ARK Schools network
- 2 Early stage programmes (Mathematics Mastery, Frontline and Expanding Horizons) – which are progressing well on their path towards independence and have raised significant external funds during the year

The enrichment and university and careers success programmes continued to raise aspirations and build the skills of ARK Schools pupils by providing an enhanced curriculum and a wide range of activities including university trips and visits, corporate mentoring programmes, speakers in schools, debating clubs and the Shakespeare Schools Festival Both programmes are moving from grant giving and delivering events to building capacity in schools and securing external opportunities for ARK Schools For example, there were five corporate mentoring partnerships in operation during the year compared with two in 2011/12

The music programme also continued to work to ensure that all pupils in ARK schools participate in a quality music programme that develops confidence, creativity, community and excellence and equips them with wider life experience that can make the difference when applying to university or for a job. Once again, a year end performance was held at the Barbican in London in 2013.

This brought together over 500 student musicians from across the ARK Schools network for a public performance that was very well received

Achievements, performance and future plans (continued)

The ARK Plus 2 programme continued to support schools to develop and deliver a comprehensive whole school approach to behaviour intervention and administer the £510k Greater London Authority grant.

ARK UK Programmes also supported research and development and innovation across the ARK network with launch of innovation prizes

The Frontline programme was developed this year with the aim of creating a standalone social enterprise to transform the life chances of vulnerable children by recruiting and developing outstanding individuals to be leaders in social work and broader society ARK provided the risk capital needed to complete the business plan and secure grant funding from the DfE to support the initial pilot. The programme has benefited from significant media coverage and launched in September 2013.

The Mathematics Mastery programme which was launched in 2011/12, delivered its programme in 30 non-ARK schools and secured two new grants totalling £800k to support its future growth. This funding has been sufficient to take the programme to a point where the initial curriculum, training and website have been developed. The majority of ongoing development and delivery costs will be covered by the fees paid by participating schools. There will be over 100 schools in the Mathematics Mastery network in 2013/14.

The Expanding Horizons programme, which supports schools to take pupils on outward bound trips to give them new skills and experiences, delivered programmes in 19 schools for 830 pupils during the year

2013/14 will see the continuation and growth of these programmes plus the development of plans for new programmes such as Click Click Reporting (CCR) The CCR team is making plans to develop the existing ARK Schools assessment model and linked reporting tools to be offered to schools outside the network. As well as strengthening assessment and data analytics practices within schools across the country, this has the added benefit of ensuring that ARK's reporting tools are managed professionally, with a long-term development and support plan

Financial review

Total ARK UK Programmes income during the year was £3 355m (2011/12 £5 603m), which included programme income of £2 509m (2011/12 £4 865m) Of this programme income, 18% went to Frontline, 23% to Mathematics Mastery, 13% went to the music programme, 10% to Expanding Horizons, 8% to the GLA programme, 7% to the University and Careers Success Programme and 21% to other programmes. The net movement in funds for the year was a surplus of £385k (2011/12 - £615k)

Financial review (continued)

This included a gain of £640k on the endowments held as investments for the schools but before a transfer of £1 069m out of the Teaching Leaders restricted fund into a separate legal entity (see note 5)

The charity had net assets at 31 August 2013 of £6 477m, compnsing £5 341m of ARK Schools endowment funds, £1 105m of other restricted funds and £31k of unrestricted funds. The free reserves of the charity (comprising of unrestricted funds) at 31 August 2013 were £31k. Given the programme related nature of the charity's activities, which are mainly funded via restricted funds, the directors consider the level of free reserves to be satisfactory.

Investment Policy

ARK UK Programmes had a portfolio of investments with a market value as at 31 August 2013 of £6 2m

There are no restrictions on the charity's power to invest. The investment strategy is set by the directors and takes into account income requirements, the risk profile and the investment manager's view of the market prospects in the medium term. The overall investment policy is to maximise total return through a diversified portfolio, aiming to provide the level of income advised by the directors and, at the same time, with a view to ensuing that capital appreciation of the fund exceeds inflation over any five year period.

The directors meet the investment managers every six months to review the performance of the portfolio and the investment strategy

The directors are satisfied that their investment policy is being achieved

Statement of directors' responsibilities

The directors (who are also trustees of ARK UK Programmes for the purposes of charity law) are responsible for preparing the directors' report and financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice)

Company law requires the directors to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the company and of the incoming resources and application of resources, including the income and expenditure, of the company for that period. Under company law, the directors must not approve the financial statements unless they are satisfied that they give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the company and of the incoming resources and application of resources, for that period.

Statement of directors' responsibilities (continued)

In preparing these financial statements, the directors are required to

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently,
- observe the methods and principles in the Statement of Recommended Practice (Accounting and Reporting by Charities) (the Charities' SORP),
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent,
- state whether applicable United Kingdom Accounting Standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements, and
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the company will continue in operation

The directors are responsible for keeping adequate accounting records that disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the company and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charitable company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

1 Accounting policies

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, as modified to include investments at market value, and in accordance with the requirements of the Companies Act 2006 Applicable United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice and the Statement of Recommended Practice "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" (SORP 2005) have been followed in the preparation of these financial statements

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Incoming resources

Incoming resources are recognised in the year in which the company is entitled to receipt and the amount can be measured with reasonable certainty. Income is deferred only when the company has to fulfil conditions before becoming entitled to it or where the donor or funder has specified that the income is to be expended in a future accounting period.

Gifts in kind income relates to free of charge services provided to ARK UK Programmes and is based on gross value to the charity

Resources expended and the basis of apportioning costs

Expenditure is included in the statement of financial activities when incurred and includes attributable VAT which cannot be recovered

Resources expended comprise the following

- a The costs of charitable activities include the direct costs of undertaking ARK UK Programmes' charitable activities together with an allocation of support costs. The basis for the allocation of support costs to charitable activities is set out in note 4 to the financial statements.
- b Governance costs represent the costs incurred by ARK UK Programmes in complying with constitutional statutory, accounting and regulatory requirements

Tangible fixed assets

All assets costing more that £2,000 and with an expected useful life exceeding one year are capitalised. Depreciation is calculated so as to write off the costs of tangible fixed assets, less their estimated residual values, on a straight line basis over the expected useful economic lives of the assets concerned. The principal annual rates for this purpose are

IT equipment

50% per annum based on cost

1 Accounting policies (continued)

Fixed assets investments

Fixed asset investments are included in the financial statements at their market value as at the balance sheet date. Realised and unrealised gains (or losses) are credited (debited) to the statement of financial activities in the year in which they arise

Fund accounting

The restricted funds are monies raised for, and their use restricted to, a specific purpose, or donations subject to the conditions imposed by the donors

The general fund represents those monies which are freely available for application towards achieving any purpose that falls within the ARK UK Programmes charitable objects

The endowment fund represents monies invested on behalf of individual ARK academies Any returns generated on these funds can be used without restriction, but only by the academy in question, and are therefore recognised as restricted income. The initial capital can only be used with agreement of the Secretary of State for Education, unless it is to be spent on 'equipment, facilities, accommodation, landscaping or signage' at the relevant academy.
