The director presents his report with the financial statements of the company for the year ended 31 December 2011

CHANGE OF NAME

The company passed a special resolution on 18th September 2012 changing its name from 111Pix com to FilmOn TV Limited

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITY

The principal activity of the company in the year under review was that of the provision of a subscription-based online cable television platform, providing a broad menu of content and live television channels that can be streamed online over the internet and mobile devices

REVIEW OF BUSINESS

Financial performance

The Income Statement on page 6 shows a loss for the year of £1,111,184 (2010 as restated £678,252) The continued losses are the result of subscription numbers remaining below the level required to match ongoing expenditure. In light of the progress made the directors are looking at means to increase subscription numbers.

Key performance indicator

Revenues increased from £119,558 in the year ended 31 December 2010 (as restated) to £223,026 in the year ended 31 December 2011 primarily due to an organic increase in aggregate European paid subscriber revenue, partly attributable to an increase in subscription rates for the region

The key non-financial performance indicator is the number of paid subscribers. As the company's parent has continued to focus on the maintenance and enhancement of its current platform without substantial marketing spending on subscriber acquisition campaigns due to lack of external investment funds, the platform has remained in a public beta stage, with paid subscribers declining to approximately 1,100 at the balance sheet date, a decline of around 1,800 subscribers when compared to the number of subscribers at the previous balance sheet date

Future Developments

The company's parent has continued to enhance and optimise the web-portal and successfully launched mobile phone versions for both IOS and Android devices. The users of the mobile app will receive a free trial version of the platform for a limited period of time, after which conversion to a fully paid web and mobile subscription will be marketed to such users. The company plans a full commercial launch in late 2012.

Going concern

During the year the company met its day to day working capital requirements through financing provided by its parent company, A A David, Talo Holdings Limited and Utopia Business Company Limited

Talo Holdings is incorporated in Saint Vincent and Grenadines and controlled by a director, A A David

Utopia Business Company Limited is incorporated in the British Virgin Islands and controlled by a director, A A David

The directors have obtained a letter of support from A A David, the ultimate controlling party, that he will continue to provide ongoing support for a period of not less than one year from the date of signing these financial statements. On this basis the directors consider it appropriate to prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis. The financial statements do not include any adjustments that would result from a withdrawal of support

ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparation

1

The company is a limited company registered in England and Wales (registered number 06047620) and is domiciled in the United Kingdom

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards as adopted by the European Union (IFRS), IFRIC Interpretations and the Companies Act 2006 applicable to companies reporting under IFRS. The principal accounting policies adopted are set out below

Going concern

During the year the company met its day to day working capital requirements through financing provided by its parent company, Mr A David, Talo Holdings Limited and Utopia Business Company Limited

Talo Holdings is incorporated in Saint Vincent and Grenadines and is controlled by a director, Mr A David

Utopia Business Company Limited is incorporated in the British Virgin Islands and is controlled by a director, Mr A David

The directors have obtained a letter of support from A A David, the ultimate controlling party, that he will continue to provide ongoing support for a period of not less than one year from the date of signing these financial statements. On this basis the directors consider it appropriate to prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis. The financial statements do not include any adjustments that would result from a withdrawal of support

Changes in accounting policies

a) Standards, amendments and interpretations effective in 2011

The following standards, amendments and interpretations were effective from 1 January 2011

Improvements to IFRSs (Issued by IASB in May 2010) Revised IAS 24 - Related Party Disclosures

The only impact on the financial statements is presentational, the underlying computation of comprehensive income and measurement of assets and liabilities remain as in previous years

b) Standards, amendments and interpretations to existing standards that are not yet endorsed by the European Union

There are no new standards, interpretations and amendments, which have not been applied in these financial statements that will have a material effect on the company's future financial statements

Revenue recognition

Subscription revenue is recognised evenly over the period of the subscription. There is no accrued income

Intangible assets

Where the company owns a content license it is stated at cost less any impairments identified

Where the company has licence to exploit content for a set period of time the licence is amortised over the relevant period

Amortisation is charged to the income statement as an administrative cost

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2011

1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES - continued

Impairment of intangible assets

All intangible assets are impaired immediately upon any indication of diminution in value

Property, plant and equipment

Tangible assets are initially recognised at cost Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life

Fixtures and fittings

- 20% on cost

Computer equipment

- 33% on cost

Financial instruments

Financial assets and liabilities are recognised on the balance sheet when the company becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the instrument. They are classified as follows

a) Cash, loans and receivables

Loans and receivables are non-derivative financial assets with fixed or determinable payments that are not quoted in an active market. They are included in current assets. The company's loans and receivables comprise of 'other receivables' and 'cash and cash equivalents'. Other receivables are recognised initially at fair value and subsequently measured at amortised cost less provision for impairment. The effect of discounting on these financial instruments is not considered material.

b) Other financial liabilities

The company recognises its financial liabilities as trade and other payables and tax payable which are recognised initially at fair value and subsequently measured at amortised cost

c) Share capital

Financial instruments issued by the company are treated as equity only to the extent that they do not meet the definition of a financial liability. The company's shares are classified as equity instruments

Taxation

Current taxes are based on the results shown in the financial statements and are calculated according to local tax rules, using tax rates enacted or substantially enacted by the balance sheet date

Financial risk management objectives and policies

The objective of the company's capital management is to ensure that it maintains strong credit ratings and capital ratios. This will ensure that the business is correctly supported and shareholder value is maximised.

The company manages its capital structure through adjustments that are dependent on economic conditions. In order to maintain or adjust the capital structure, the company may choose to change or amend dividend payments to shareholders or issue new share capital to shareholders. There were no changes to the objectives, policies or processes during the year ended 31 December 2011

Foreign currencies

Assets and liabilities in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rates of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. Transactions in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rate of exchange ruling at the date of transaction. Exchange differences are taken into account in arriving at the operating result.

1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES - continued

Deferred tax

Deferred tax is calculated on the comprehensive basis using the liability method, which requires provision for temporary differences between the tax bases of assets and liabilities and their carrying amounts on the balance sheet. Tax rates enacted at the balance sheet date are used to determine the deferred tax balances. Deferred tax assets are not recognised as it is not probable that future taxable profit will be available against which the asset can be utilised.

Critical accounting estimates and judgements

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with IFRS requires the use of certain critical accounting estimates. It also requires management to exercise its judgement in the process of applying the company's accounting policies.

The areas involving a higher degree of judgement or complexity, or areas where assumptions and estimates are significant to the financial statements are as follows

Valuation of online content

The directors assess the value of this on an item by item basis on an ongoing basis. Where content is deemed to be impaired it is immediately written off

Depreciation and amortisation rates

The directors have used judgement to select the rates at which categories of asset are depreciated or amortised. The rates used are designed to best reflect the underlying value of the assets over their useful lives

Legal proceedings

In accordance with IFRSs the company recognises a provision where there is a present obligation from a past event, a transfer of economic benefits it probable and the amount of costs of the transfer can be estimated reliably. In instances where the criteria are not met, a contingent liability may be disclosed in the notes to the financial statements. Obligations arising in respect of contingent liabilities that have been disclosed, or those which are not currently recognised or disclosed in the financial statements, could have a material effect on the company's financial position. Application of these accounting principles to legal cases requires the company's management to make determinations about various factual and legal matters beyond its control. The company reviews outstanding legal cases following developments in the legal proceedings and at each reporting date, in order to assess the need for provisions and disclosures in its financial statements. Among the factors considered in making decisions on provisions are the nature of the litigation, claim or assessment, the legal process and potential level of damages in the jurisdiction in which the litigation, claim or assessment has been brought, the progress of the case (including the progress after the date of the financial statements but before those statements are issued), the opinions or views of legal advisors, experience on similar cases and any decision of the company's management as to how it will respond to the litigation, claim or assessment.

2 SEGMENTAL REPORTING

The directors consider the primary reporting format to be by business segment. At present there is only one business segment being the provision of a subscription-based online cable to platform, providing a broad menu of content and live to channels that are streamed online over the internet and mobile devices, therefore the disclosures for the primary segment have already been given in these financial statements

The secondary reporting format is by geographical segment. The majority of turnover is recognised in the UK

All non-current assets and liabilities are held within the UK

The depreciation and amortisation of website development and intangible assets adjustment represent amounts which were capitalised in the company in prior years in error. The costs of website development and intangible assets are now recognised in the results of the parent company. The depreciation and amortisation charged in this company in previous years has been written back to the Profit and Loss Account. The effect to the company is to decrease intangible and tangible assets, decrease the amount due to the parent company and decrease costs.

7 PRIOR YEAR ADJUSTMENT- continued

The recognition of deferred income is the correction of an error in the revenue recognition policy in the previous period to ensure it complies with IAS 18. The result of this is a reduction in revenue and an increase in deferred income.

The non-group costs incurred that have been removed are the result of costs erroneously recognised in the company in 2010 whereas they related to a company outside of the group. The effect of this is that direct costs have reduced and other debtors have increased

The charge for the use of the platform represented amounts charged for use of the platform that was previously not recorded in the books of the company in error. The effect of this is an increase in cost of sales and a decrease in other creditors.

(11) Price risk

The price paid for utilities is subject to market movement, however as these costs are not significant for the company this will have minimal impact on the operations of the company

(111) Fair value interest rate risk

The company does not have significant cash balances which expose it to movements in market interest rates. The company also has no liabilities which accrue interest at a variable rate and therefore the company has no exposure to interest rate risk on borrowings.

b) Credit risk

The company does not hold any trade receivables due from external customers and is therefore not exposed to any significant credit risk

c) Liquidity risk

Prudent liquidity risk management implies maintaining sufficient cash. Management monitors rolling forecasts of the company's liquidity reserve. The review consists of considering the liquidity of local markets, projecting cash flows and the level of liquid assets to meet these. The management raise additional capital financing when the review indicates this to be necessary.
