On our Basic skills supports - 16 people have registered for ESOL Beginners and Elementary level in 2011. In additional, we have created the Saturday class to cater people who works during the week, which led to an increase of basic skills hours. In total we have delivered 142 hours on ESOL Beginners alone. People we helped and supported this year are the Polish, Lithuanian, Brazilian, Caribbean, Algerian, Chinese, Indian, Srilankan, Asian, Pakistan and German During 2011 ABMEC have supported a total of 633.5 hours of basic skills training classes and other basic skills workshops to the BME communities in Cambridgeshire. A total of 382 clients have acquired the self-confidence and skills training to increase their life chances and opportunities for job fulfilement. We have continued to work closely with the communities, local partners and individuals in improving life chances for progression in personel development and training.
