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COMMENCEMENT OF ACTIVITIES

The company was incorporated 5 March 2007 and was dormant until the activities relating to the Mount Pleasant community centre were transferred on 1 December 2009. The limited company registered as a charity on 11 May 2010.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

The charity is controlled by its governing document, the memorandum and articles of association of the company incorporated 5 March 2007, and constitutes a limited company, limited by guarantee, as defined by the Companies Act 2006

Appointment of trustees

Trustees are appointed in accordance with the governing document, the memorandum and articles of association of the company

Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 31 March 2012

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

- To advance education and to provide facilities in the interest of social welfare for recreation and leisure time occupation with the object of improving the conditions of life for the inhabitants of Bradford-On-Avon and the neighbourhood
- To maintain and manage the mount pleasant centre (whether in co-operation with any local authority or other person or body) in furtherance of these objects
- 3 To promote such other charitable purposes for the inhabitants of Bradford-On-Avon and the neighbourhood as the trustees may from time to time determine

Public Benefit

The trustees confirm that they have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing the charity's aims and objectives and in planning future activities

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

The charity is currently improving the accommodation used by local organisations such as 4 children, Characters, Dance, Keep fit and others

During the year, the board have over-seen the tidying up of the decorations within the centre building. This has notably taken place in Room 3 with some of obsolete items removed and scrapped which improved storage.

Some better second hand tables were required for Room 2 which improved the overall appearance. Further security cameras were installed around the whole complex to prevent vandalism or damage to the car park and wall

The Board also sponsored the use of Room 3 earlier in the year for the use of a severely handicapped local young man for Boccia Practice prior to the Para Olympic final trials

The culmination of the years work has been the approval to go ahead with the planned project to install further toilet facility's at both ends of the building to allow disabled access and improve the existing toilet area. In addition this work will include refurbishment of two upper rooms and a new staircase. This will considerably improve the letting capacity and remove an older staircase which is a health and safety issue.

There are also on-going minor projects which are being considered such as secondary double glazing and a replacement of the current heating system. Ideally they might fit in with the staged improvement project

The Board is also working closing with the Town Council to offer temporary accommodation to groups that may be affected by the refurbishment work to St Margaret's Hall, Bradford on Avon

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees
