Respective responsibilities of directors and auditor



**Notes to the abbreviated accounts
for the year ended 31 March 2011**

1. Principal accounting policies

The principal accounting policies are summarised below. They have all been applied consistently throughout the current and preceding years.

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the special provisions applicable to companies subject to the small companies regime and the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (FRSSE) (effective April 2008).

The directors consider that the ultimate controlling party is Guy's and St Thomas' NHS Foundation Trust and as such has taken advantage of the exemption available under s400 Companies Act 2006 not to produce group accounts. Copies of the Guy's and St Thomas' NHS Foundation Trust consolidated group accounts can be obtained from Counting House, Guy's Hospital, Great Maze Pond, London, SE1 9RT.

Going Concern

As discussed further in the Directors' report the directors have a reasonable expectation that the company has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. For this reason, they continue to adopt the going concern basis in the preparation of the accounts.

Turnover

Turnover represents the value of services provided during the year. The amount excludes VAT. Turnover is attributable to the company's principal activity and all arises from the United Kingdom.

Intangible Assets

Recognition

Intangible assets are non-monetary assets without physical substance which are capable of being sold separately from the rest of the company's business or which arise from contractual or other legal rights. Intangible assets are capitalised when they are capable of being used in activities for more than one year, they can be valued, and they have a cost of at least £5,000.

1. Principal accounting policies (continued)

Intangible Assets (continued)

Software

Software which is integral to the operation of hardware, e.g. an operating system, would be capitalised as part of the relevant item of property, plant and equipment. Software which is not integral to the operation of hardware, e.g. application software, is capitalised as an intangible asset.

Amortisation

Intangible assets are amortised over their expected useful economic lives in a manner consistent with the consumption of economic or service delivery benefits.

Assets under construction

Intangible assets under construction are capitalised if they are considered to be development expenditure relating to a clearly defined project with related expenditure, are separately identifiable and where the outcome of the project is reasonably certain as to their technical feasibility and ultimate commercial viability. Such assets are initially recorded at cost. Intangible assets are amortised in the quarter following completion.

Investments

Fixed asset investments are shown at cost less provision for impairment.

Taxation

Current tax, including UK corporation tax and foreign tax, is provided at amounts expected to be paid (or recovered) using the tax rates that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date.

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date where transactions or events that result in an obligation to pay more tax in the future or a right to pay less tax in the future have occurred at the balance sheet date. Timing differences are differences between the company's taxable profits and its results as stated in the financial statements that arise from the inclusion of gains and losses in tax assessments in periods different from those in which they are recognised in the financial statements.
